# International Scientific Committee of the EASTS Notice of Recruitment of Committee Members 2014-2015

The International Scientific Committee (ISC) of the EASTS is seeking new members who are willing to work for future activities of EASTS.

ISC members (currently 99) have been contributing significantly to paper review works for the previous conference in Taipei. 20 members have contributed to the works for more than six years (three terms) and should be replaced by new members. EASTS has already held ten conferences until now and has developed the academic capacity in younger generation in Asia through these conferences. Therefore, it seems possible to welcome many new members especially from <u>younger generation</u> and <u>females</u> in transportation or related fields as well as the <u>EASTS awardees</u>.

In the previous conference, the paper management work has been divided into two different tracks, Academic Paper management Track (APT) and Practical Paper management Track (PPT) in order to increase the number of Practical Papers by practitioner and in order to reduce our review workloads. We are now discussing the possibility on introducing a new paper review system for Practical Papers in the next conference, and the detail will be announced at the timing of the delivery of "Call for Paper". Besides, a special team for publication of the "Asian Transportation Studies" will be newly organized by around 10 selected ISC members in order to maintain the quality of the journal with minimum workload. And this team will not be involved in the paper review process of the conference journal.

Owing to the reasons above, ISC should add many new ISC members at this moment. In concrete, around **40** new members for **APT** (both **academician** and **practitioner**) and **5** for **PPT** (mainly **practitioner**) will be recruited in the summer of 2014 for the preparation toward the next conference in Cebu. We welcome any researchers or practical experts of all transportation related fields. Please note that serving in the ISC is completely *voluntary*.

### 1) Requirements for new ISC members

- must be an EASTS member

- must have four or more years of full-time work experience in transportation-related research or practical fields, after having received a title of either doctoral degree or APEC engineer (or other professional title officially certified as equivalent to APEC engineers).
- must have enough capability for reviewing papers and passion for the activities of the EASTS-ISC.

# 2) Term of ISC members in principle FOR APT

- Two years (one conference); may be reappointed maximum twice (more two conferences).

# FOR PPT

- Two years (one conference); may be reappointed maximum once (more one conference).

#### 3) Role and functions

- Managing papers as a Chief reviewer or a Topic Group Chief both for APT and PPT and/or a secretariat
- Organizing and programming sessions of Conference
- Publishing papers
- Fostering research fields particularly in Asian context

#### 5) Selection procedure

Applicants' CV and submitted document will be evaluated by the recruitment sub-committee of ISC. In the evaluation process, a good mixture of major research and working field, age, sex and nationalities will be considered. Please check the topic groups and their research fields at the bottom of this letter (these classifications may be revised slightly). We give an emphasis on the following countries/regions: <u>Australia, Hong Kong, Japan, Korea, Lao, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, New Zealand, Philippines and Singapore</u>. As well, we give an emphasis on the following Topic Group Code: <u>C, F, G, and I</u>.
