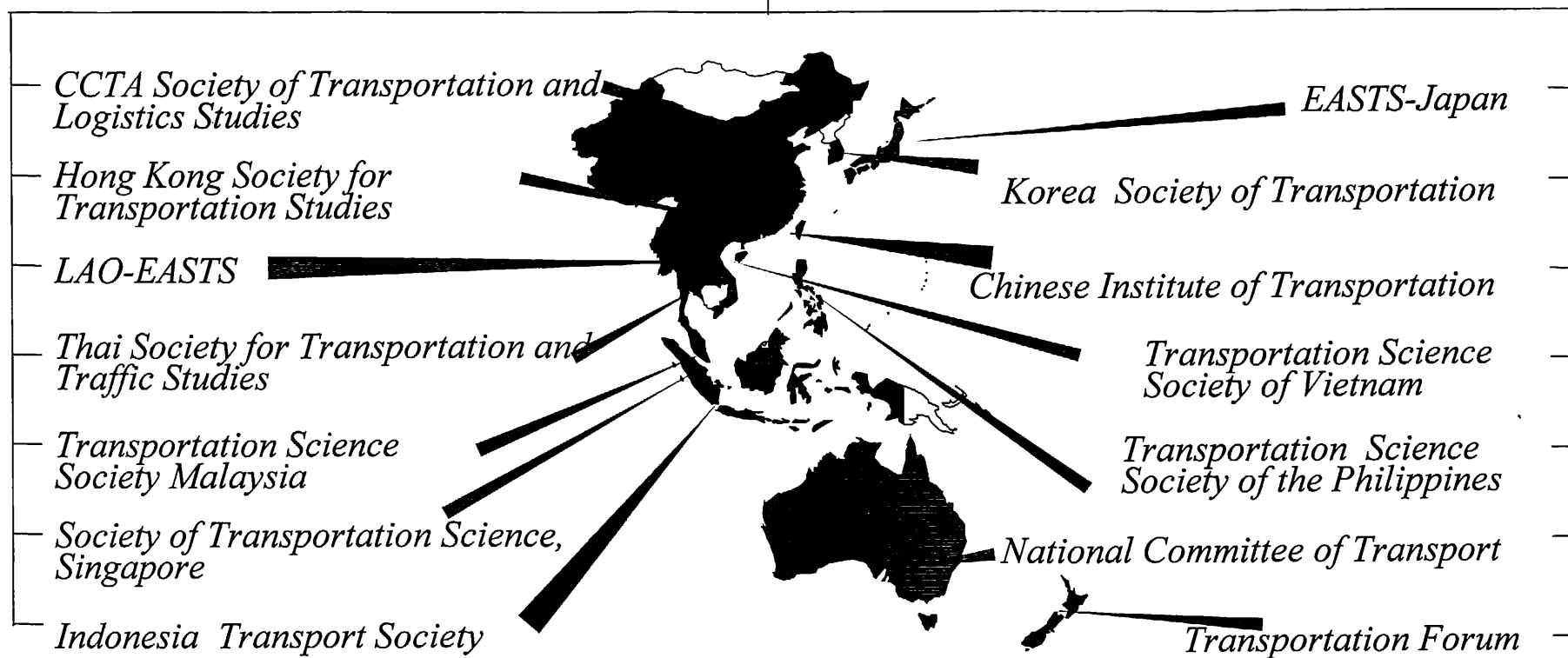

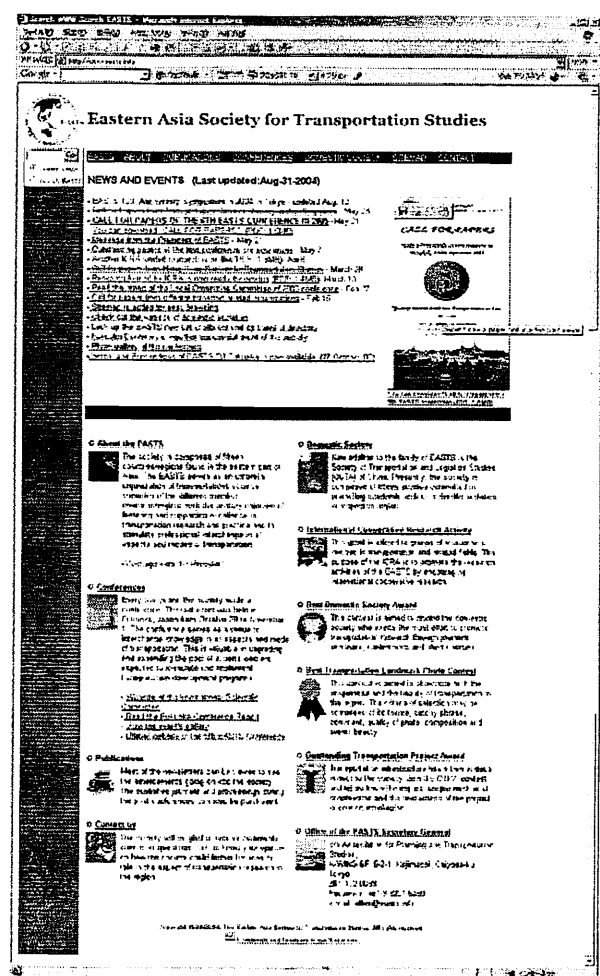

Purpose

The Eastern Asia Society for Transportation Studies (EASTS) is offering research grants to a group of researchers involved in transportation and related fields through its International Cooperative Research Activity (ICRA). The purpose of the ICRA is to promote the research activities of the EASTS by encouraging international cooperative research.

Requirements

To truly attain the objective of fostering international collaborative efforts, the members of the research group should be composed of researchers from two or more countries/areas. Interested groups are required to submit an application form with the research proposal for consideration and approval by the EASTS Board Meeting. Grantees are expected to present the results of their collaborative research in a special session of the next EASTS conference.

CONSTITUTION OF
EASTERN ASIA SOCIETY FOR TRANSPORTATION STUDIES

ARTICLE I

General Provisions

Section 1.1 Name of The Organization - The name of the organization shall be Eastern Asia Society for Transportation Studies, acronymed EASTS, and hereinafter referred to as the Society.

Section 1.2 Geographical Scope of the Society - Its scope covers Eastern Asia countries and appropriate areas (hereinafter called simply countries/areas), including Oceania regions.

Section 1.3 Headquarters - The Society shall maintain a headquarter office in Tokyo, Japan.

Section 1.4 Objectives - The objectives of the Society are to foster and support excellence in transportation research and practice and to stimulate professional interchange in all aspects and modes of transportation.

Section 1.5 Activities - The primary activity of the Society is to organize, generally once every two years, a Conference on Transportation Studies, gathering researchers and practitioners from member countries/areas. Aside from the Conference, in order to achieve the objectives mentioned in Section 1.4, the following activities shall be undertaken:

- (a) Conduct of symposia, seminars and workshops.
- (b) Publication of a newsletters and technical material.
- (c) Establishment of a Transportation Database easily accessible by all members of the Society.
- (d) Pursuit of other activities to attain the objectives of the society.

ARTICLE II

Membership

Section 2.1 Classification of Membership - The members of the Society shall consist of Country Members who shall represent member countries/areas and Regular Members.

Section 2.2 Member Countries - Membership of the Society is open to all countries/areas lying within or bordering above mentioned areas in Section 1.2, and to those countries/areas with special interests in the area, that possess a competent scientific or professional body to act as the domestic society, that wish to become members, and that are prepared to pay appropriate annual dues.

Section 2.3 Country Members - A Country Member shall be the president or the duly authorized representative of the domestic society. Application for membership shall be submitted to the Board of Directors through such an organization, which shall serve as the domestic society.

Section 2.4 Regular members - Each domestic society shall select Regular Members who are recognized experts in transportation with sufficient experience in the profession. In the event that there is no existing domestic society, admission as a regular member is through the recommendation of at least two regular members of the Society and approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 2.5 Rights of Regular Members - All Regular Members shall have the following rights and privileges:

- (a) To participate in all deliberations/ meetings of the Society;
- (b) To have access to all of the facilities of the association;
- (c) To examine all the records or books of the Society during business hours.

ARTICLE III

Organization

Section 3.1 The organs of the Society - The organs shall include the Board of Directors, a Scientific Committee, a Conference Committee and a Secretariat. The highest level of decision-making organization of the Society shall be the Board of Directors (hereafter referred to as the Board), under which the Scientific and the Conference Committee shall be formed for the purpose of organizing conferences.

Section 3.2 Officers of the Society - The Society shall be headed by a President and two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary-General and a Treasurer who shall be members of the Board.

Section 3.3 Election of Officers and Term of Office - A President is elected from among Country Members at a meeting of the Board. The elected President shall recommend two Vice-Presidents from the Country Members, and a Secretary-General and a Treasurer among Regular Members for approval by the Board. The elected officers shall hold office for a period of four(4) years, or until such time as their duly elected successors have qualified.

Section 3.4 Other Officers and Agents - The Board may appoint such other officers and agents as it shall deem necessary, and who shall hold office for such terms and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as shall be determined by the Board.

ARTICLE IV

Duties of the Officers

Section 4.1 Duties of the President - The President shall preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board. The President shall exercise such powers and performs such duties incident to his office and such other duties as may from time to time delegated to him/her by the Board. Among other, the President shall:

- (a) Preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board;
- (b) Represent the society in all activities to which it is a party or participant;
- (c) Organize and supervise work groups among the members of the society.

Section 4.2 Duties of the Vice-Presidents - The First Vice-President shall, in the absence or disability of the President, perform the duties of the President and such other duties as the Board may from time to time prescribe. The Second Vice-President shall perform the duties of a Conference Director, and shall chair the Conference Committee.

Section 4.3 Duties of the Secretary-General - The Secretary-General shall:

- (a) Keep the minutes of the meeting of the members of the Board;
- (b) Deliver all notices in accordance with the resolutions of the meetings of the Board;
- (c) Keep all corporate records and the seal of the Society which shall be affixed to such instruments as may be required and thereupon be attested by his signature or that of the Treasurer;
- (d) Keep register of the names and past officers of all members;
- (e) In general, perform all duties incident to the office of the Secretary-General and such other duties as may from time to time be assigned by the Board.

Section 4.4 Duties of the Treasurer - The Treasurer shall:

- (a) Have charge and custody of and be responsible for the funds of the Society;

- (b) Shall disburse the funds of the Society for specific purpose authorized by a resolution of the Board;
- (c) Shall take charge and have custody of petty cash funds as may be fixed by the Board;
- (d) Be responsible for keeping the financial records of the Society and the liquidation of any and all accounts, liabilities and obligations owing on dues from the Society;
- (e) Shall monitor all delinquencies and send notices on overdue Society's dues and/or demand letters;
- (f) In general, perform all the duties incident to the office of the Treasurer and such other duties as may from time to time may be assigned by the Board.

ARTICLE V

Board of Directors

Section 5.1 General Powers - The Board of Directors shall have general supervision and control of the business and the affairs of the society.

Section 5.2 Board Member - The Board shall be composed of Country Members from the member countries/areas and elected Regular Members (Officers). Only Country Member shall have voting right.

Section 5.3 Vacancies - Any vacancy of officer(s) occurring in the Board by resignation, removal, death or incapacity, shall be filled in the same way described in Section 3.3, at any regular meeting of the Board, as long as a quorum exists at that meeting. The officer(s) so elected shall serve the unexpired terms of the director(s) replaced.

Section 5.4 Regular Board Meeting - The regular meeting of the Board shall be held every year. One will be held during the regular biannual Conference, and the other will be held in Tokyo during the year when there is no regular Conference, or at such other times and places as the Board may

determine.

Section 5.5 Special Board Meeting - A special meeting of the Board shall be held whenever called by the President or on written call of a majority of the Directors.

Section 5.6 Quorum - A majority of all the Directors shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Board. Proxies of Directors who are not present shall also be counted and included in the number of attending Directors.

ARTICLE VI

Scientific Committee

Section 6.1 Role - The Scientific Committee is authorized by the Board of Directors for the purpose of assisting the Directorate of the Conference, and ensuring a high level of scientific quality of the Conference, among others, with the call for papers, invited papers, the selection of contributions to be presented and contributions to be published, and the recommendation of the candidates for awards and recognition.

Section 6.2 Members - The Scientific Committee consists of a chair, an appropriate number of session organizers who shall be appointed by the Board, and the Conference Director (the Chair of the Conference Committee). The Chair of the Scientific Committee, who shall be recommended by the President for approval by the Board, may attend meetings of the Board.

Section 6.3 Duties of the Chair - The Chair of the Scientific Committee shall manage the whole organization of the Conference in terms of its scientific aspects such as :

- (a) coordinating session organizers of the Conference;
- (b) reporting to the Board the program of its activities.

Section 6.4 Session Organizer - Each member of the Scientific Committee must organize a Session of the Conference for the purpose of encouraging the development of transportation research and excellence in professional practice, seeking solutions to important problems of Eastern Asia interest, and aiding in the dissemination of scientific information.

Section 6.5 Regular Committee Meetings - The Scientific Committee shall meet once every two years during the regular Conference or at such other times and places as the Chair may determine.

Section 6.6 Special Committee Meetings - A special meeting of the Scientific Committee shall be held whenever called by the Chair or on written call of a majority of the members of Scientific Committee.

ARTICLE VII

Conference Committee

Section 7.1 Role of the Conference Committee - The Conference Committee is constituted by the Board for the purpose of providing overall directions and guidance, and deciding on the general program structure of the regular Conference in cooperation with the Scientific Committee.

Section 7.2 Organization - The host country/area of the Conference shall organize the Conference Committee headed by the Conference Director who is appointed as the Second Vice-President at the same time.

Section 7.3 Duties of the Conference Director - The Conference Director shall chair the Conference Committee, and take all the responsibilities related to the Conference.

ARTICLE VIII

Funds of the Society

Section 8.1 Funds - The funds of the Society shall be derived from the annual dues collected from the domestic societies, gifts, donations or endowments from public or private institutions.

Section 8.2 Category of Country Member - The contribution to the Society is generally related to the number of Regular Members of each domestic society. The table below gives a useful information of the category to which a Country Member belongs:

No. of Regular Members	Category
less than 25	1
25 to 74	2
75 to 149	3
more than 149	4

Section 8.3 Dues - Country Members shall pay the following annual dues immediately upon notification of their acceptance:

Category	Annual Dues
1	US\$ 50
2	US\$ 300
3	US\$ 2,000
4	US\$ 5,000

Section 8.4 Increases in the Annual Dues - The annual dues provided in this Constitution may be increased upon the proposal of Country Member(s) subject to the approval of the Board. In no case shall any such increases be made more often than once every two years.

Section 8.5 Disbursements - Withdrawal from the funds of the Society, whether by check or any other instrument, shall be signed by the

Treasurer and countersigned by the President. If necessary, the Board may designate other signatories.

Section 8.6 Fiscal Year - The fiscal year of the Society shall be from 1st of January to 31st of December of each year.

ARTICLE IX

Voting

Voting in the Meeting of the Board of Directors - The weights of votes of a Country Member shall be determined based on the total amount of annual contribution to the Society as follows:

ARTICLE X

Official Language

The official language of the Society shall be English. Other languages may be used provided that the Regular Member brings his/her translator at his/her own expense.

ARTICLE XI

Amendments

This constitution, or any provision thereof, may be amended or repealed by a majority vote of the Directors at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors duly held for the purpose.

ARTICLE XII

Transitory Provision

Section 12.1 Individual Members - The Society shall initially be composed of Individual Members from various countries/areas who attend the organizational meeting held in Ito City, Japan from 26 to 27 November 1994. Each Individual Member shall remain as such until a domestic society in the country/area where he comes from has been admitted as a Country Member of the Society and named its representative.

Section 12.2 Voting Rights of Individual Members - The vote of each Individual Member shall have a weights of one(1). Each Individual Member shall exercise the right to vote during his tenure but not later than eighteen(18) month after passage of this constitution.

**AMENDED CONSTITUTION OF
EASTERN ASIA SOCIETY FOR TRANSPORTATION STUDIES (EASTS) ¹⁾**

¹⁾: The constitution was amended by the board of directors at its meeting on 16 September 1999 in Taipei

ARTICLE I

General Provisions

- Section 1.1** **Name of The Organization** - The name of the organization shall be Eastern Asia Society for Transportation Studies, acronymed EASTS, and hereinafter referred to as the Society.
- Section 1.2** **Geographical Scope of the Society** - Its scope covers Eastern Asia countries and appropriate areas (hereinafter called simply countries/areas), including Oceanic regions
- Section 1.3** **Headquarters** - The Society shall maintain a headquarter office in Tokyo, Japan.
- Section 1.4** **Objectives** - The objectives of the Society are to foster and support excellence in transportation research and practice and to stimulate professional exchange in all aspects and modes of transportation.
- Section 1.5** **Activities** - The primary activity of the Society is to organize, generally once every two years, a Conference on Transportation Studies, gathering researchers and practitioners from member countries/areas. Aside from the Conference, in order to achieve the objectives mentioned in Section 1.4, the following activities shall be undertaken:
- (a) Conduct of symposia, seminars and workshops.
 - (b) Publication of newsletters and technical materials.
 - (c) Establishment of a Transportation Database easily accessible by all members of the Society.
 - (d) Pursuit of other activities to attain the objectives of the society.

ARTICLE II

Membership

- Section 2.1** **Classification of Membership** - The members of the Society shall consist of Country Members who shall represent member of domestic societies and Regular Members.
- Section 2.2** **Member Domestic Society Countries** - Membership of the Society is open to all

domestic Societies operating within the areas in Section 1.2, and to those domestic societies with special interests in the area, that wish to become members, and that are prepared to pay appropriate annual dues. Application for membership shall be submitted by the interested domestic society to the EASTS Board of Directors for approval.

Section 2.3

Representative Members – Representative Members shall be the president and/or the duly authorized representative of the member domestic societies. The number of Representative Members for a domestic society shall be based upon its category as defined in Section 8.2. Category 1 shall have one Representative Member; Category 2, two Representative Members; Category 3, three Representative Members; and Category 4, six Representative Members. The Representative Members shall have the same rights and duties of Regular Members as enumerated in Section 2.5 plus the following:

- (a) To elect the Directors-at-large;
- (b) To ratify proposed amendments to the Constitution; and
- (c) To vote on all matters normally reserved for the general membership to decide on.

Section 2.4

Regular members - Each domestic society shall select Regular Members who are recognized experts in transportation with sufficient experience in the profession. In the event that there is no existing domestic society, admission as a regular member is through the recommendation of at least two regular members of the Society and approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 2.5

Rights of Regular Members - All Regular Members shall have the following rights and privileges:

- (a) To participate in all deliberations/meetings of the Society;
- (b) To have access to all of the facilities of the association; and
- (c) To examine all the records or books of the Society during business hours.

ARTICLE III

Organization

Section 3.1

The Organs of the Society - The organs shall include the Board of Directors, a Scientific Committee, a Conference Committee and a Secretariat. The highest level of decision-making organization of the Society shall be the Board of Directors (hereafter referred to as the Board), under which the Scientific and the Conference Committee shall be formed for the purpose of organizing conferences.

Section 3.2

Officers of the Society - The Society shall be headed by a President and two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary-General and a Treasurer who shall be members of the Board.

Section 3.3

Election of Officers and Term of Office - A President is elected from among Board

Members at a meeting of the Board. The elected President shall recommend two Vice-Presidents from the Board Members, and a Secretary-General and a Treasurer among Representative Members or Regular Members for approval by the Board. The elected officers shall hold office for a period of four (4) years, or until such time as their duly elected successors have qualified.

Section 3.4 Other Officers and Agents - The Board may appoint such other officers and agents as it shall deem necessary, and who shall hold office for such terms and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as shall be determined by the Board.

ARTICLE IV

Duties of the Officers

Section 4.1 Duties of the President - The President shall preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board. The President shall exercise such powers and performs such duties incident to his/her office and such other duties as may from time to time delegated to him/her by the Board. Among other, the President shall:

- (a) Preside at all meetings of the members and of the Board;
- (b) Represent the society in all activities to which it is a party or participant; and
- (c) Organize and supervise work groups among the members of the society.

Section 4.2 Duties of the Vice-Presidents - The First Vice-President shall, in the absence or disability of the President, perform the duties of the President and such other duties as the Board may from time to time prescribe. The Second Vice-President shall perform the duties of a Conference Director, and shall chair the Conference Committee.

Section 4.3 Duties of the Secretary-General - The Secretary-General shall:

- (a) Keep the minutes of the meeting of the members of the Board;
- (b) Deliver all notices in accordance with the resolutions of the meetings of the Board;
- (c) Keep all corporate records and the seal of the Society which shall be affixed to such instruments as may be required and thereupon be attested by his/her signature or that of the Treasurer;
- (d) Keep register of the names and past officers of all members; and
- (e) In general, perform all duties incident to the office of the Secretary-General and such other duties as may from time to time be assigned by the Board.

Section 4.4 Duties of the Treasurer - The Treasurer shall:

- (a) Have charge and custody of and be responsible for the funds of the Society;
- (b) Disburse the funds of the Society for specific purpose authorized by a resolution of the Board;
- (c) Take charge and have custody of petty cash funds as may be fixed by the

Board;

- (d) Be responsible for keeping the financial records of the Society and the liquidation of any and all accounts, liabilities and obligations owing on dues from the Society;
- (e) Monitor all delinquencies and send notices on overdue Society's dues and/or demand letters; and
- (f) In general, perform all the duties incident to the office of the Treasurer and such other duties as may from time to time be assigned by the Board.

ARTICLE V

Board of Directors

Section 5.1 General Powers - The Board of Directors shall have general supervision and control of the business and affairs of the society.

Section 5.2 Board Member - The Board shall be composed of one representative from each country/area as the society(ies) in that country/area; three Directors-at-large elected by Representative and/or Regular Members (officers). The Directors-at-large shall hold office for a period of four (4) years, coinciding with the term of office of the officers of the Society, or until such time as their duly elected successors have qualified. Should any Director-at-large fail to complete his/her term by at least one year due to resignation or any unavoidable circumstances, the Board shall elect from among the Representative Members his/her replacement to serve the unexpired portion of his/her term. Former presidents of the Society shall sit in the Board as Advisers and ex-officio members without the right of vote.

Section 5.3 Vacancies - Any vacancy of officer(s) occurring in the Board by resignation, removal, death or incapacity, shall be filled in the same way described in Section 3.3, at any regular meeting of the Board, as long as a quorum exists at that meeting. The officer(s) so elected shall serve the unexpired terms of the director(s) replaced.

Section 5.4 Regular Board Meeting - The regular meeting of the Board shall be held every year. One will be held during the regular biannual Conference, and the other will be held in Tokyo during the year when there is no regular Conference, or at such other times and places as the Board may determine.

Section 5.5 Special Board Meeting - A special meeting of the Board shall be held whenever called by the President or on written call of a majority of the Directors.

Section 5.6 Quorum - A majority of all the Directors shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Board..

ARTICLE VI

Scientific Committee

- Section 6.1** **Role** - The Scientific Committee is authorized by the Board of Directors for the purpose of assisting the Directorate of the Conference, and ensuring a high level of scientific quality of the Conference, among others, with the call for papers, invited papers, the selection of contributions to be presented and contributions to be published, and the recommendation of the candidates for awards and recognition.
- Section 6.2** **Members** - The Scientific Committee consists of a chair, an appropriate number of session organizers who shall be appointed by the Board, and the Conference Director (the Chair of the Conference Committee). The Chair of the Scientific Committee, who shall be recommended by the President for approval by the Board, may attend meetings of the Board.
- Section 6.3** **Duties of the Chair** - The Chair of the Scientific Committee shall manage the whole organization of the Conference in terms of its scientific aspects such as :
(a) Coordinating session organizers of the Conference;
(b) Reporting to the Board the program of its activities.
- Section 6.4** **Session Organizer** - Each member of the Scientific Committee must organize a Session of the Conference for the purpose of encouraging the development of transportation research and excellence in professional practice, seeking solutions to important problems of Eastern Asia interest, and aiding in the dissemination of scientific information.
- Section 6.5** **Regular Committee Meetings** - The Scientific Committee shall meet once every two years during the regular Conference or at such other times and places as the Chair may determine.
- Section 6.6** **Special Committee Meetings** - A special meeting of the Scientific Committee shall be held whenever called by the Chair or on written call of a majority of the members of Scientific Committee.

ARTICLE VII

Conference Committee

- Section 7.1** **Role of the Conference Committee** - The Conference Committee is constituted by the Board for the purpose of providing overall directions and guidance, and deciding on the general program structure of the regular Conference in cooperation with the Scientific Committee.
- Section 7.2** **Organization** - The host domestic society of the Conference shall organize the

Conference Committee headed by the Conference Director who is appointed as the Second Vice-President at the same time.

Section 7.3

Duties of the Conference Director - The Conference Director shall chair the Conference Committee, and take all the responsibilities related to the Conference.

ARTICLE VIII

Funds of the Society

Section 8.1

Funds - The funds of the Society shall be derived from the annual dues collected from the domestic societies, gifts, donations or endowments from public or private institutions.

Section 8.2

Category of Member Domestic Society - The contribution to the Society is generally related to the number of Regular Members of each domestic society. The table below gives useful information of the category to which a Member Domestic Society belongs:

Section 8.3

Dues - Domestic Societies shall pay the following annual dues immediately upon notification of their acceptance:

Section 8.4

Increases in the Annual Dues - The annual dues provided in this Constitution may be increased by the Board. In no case shall any such increases be made more often than once every two years.

Section 8.5

Disbursements - Withdrawal from the funds of the Society, whether by check or any other instrument, shall be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the

President. If necessary, the Board may designate other signatories.

Section 8.6 **Fiscal Year** - The fiscal year of the Society shall be from 1st of January to 31st of December of each year.

ARTICLE IX

Meetings of Representative Members

Section 9.1 **Regular and Special Meetings** - The Representative Members shall meet regularly once every four years for the main purpose of electing the new Directors-at-large. Regular meetings shall preferably be held to coincide with an EASTS Conference. A special meeting may be held whenever call by the President or on written call of a majority of the Directors.

Section 9.2 **Quorum and Proxies** - A majority of all Representative Members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Representative Members. Any Representative Member may be designated as a proxy of absent Representative Members. Such designation must be made in writing by the Representative Members concerned or by the President of the Domestic Society to which the absent Representative Members belong. Proxies shall be counted for purposes of determining quorum.

ARTICLE X

Official Language

The official language of the Society shall be English. Other languages may be used provided that the Regular Member brings his/her translator at his/her own expense.

ARTICLE XI

Amendments

This constitution, or any provision thereof, may be amended or repealed by a majority vote of the Directors at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors duly held for the purpose, subject to ratification by a majority vote of all Representative Members at a regular or special meeting held for the purpose.

ARTICLE XII

Transitory Provision

Section 12.1 **Individual Members** - The Society shall initially be composed of Individual Members from various countries/areas who attend the organizational meeting held in Ito City, Japan from 26 to 27 November 1994. Each Individual Member shall remain as such until a domestic society in the country/area where he comes from has been admitted as a Country Member of the Society and named as its representative.

Section 12.2 **Voting Rights of Individual Members** - The vote of each Individual Member shall have a weight of one (1). Each Individual Member shall exercise the right to vote during his/her tenure but not later than eighteen (18) months after passage of this constitution.

Section 12.3 **Term of Office of First Set of Officers** - The first set of officers shall hold office until the election of new set of officers in the year 2000 except the Second Vice-President whose term of office is two years.

Minutes of Representatives Meeting Toward Establishing the Eastern Asia Society for Transportation Studies

Date: 26-28 November 1994

Venue: Ito, Shizuoka-Prefecture, Japan

1. Opening Remarks were given by Mr. Hideo Nakamura.

2. The participants introduced themselves.

3. Proposal for the new society was presented as written in document B-2 by Mr. Shigeru Morichi.

4. Current Status of each domestic society was reported.

5. Name of the society was discussed and decided as:

Eastern Asia Society for Transportation Studies (EASTS)

6. Constitution of the Society was proposed by Mr. Shigeru Morichi and the main framework was accepted with amendment of phrasing and English within one month. The following were agreed;

- 1) Organization and the functions of its components as proposed by Mr. Shigeru Morichi.
- 2) Members of Board of Directors are the representative members only from the countries and appropriate areas which have established domestic societies corresponding to EASTS.

- In addition, Mr. Inamura requested for the: 1) sending of the member list of each domestic society which should include the affiliation and research field of each member; 2) appointment of another vice-chairman of International Scientific Committee, Mr. Kyung Soo Chon from Korea; 3) awarding of prizes for excellent papers; and 4) printing of the journal of the EASTS.
- Mr. Mao proposed an electronic version of the EASTS Journal

5. International Cooperative Research (ICR)

- Mr. Morichi proposed three areas of cooperative research:
 - a) international transport issues such as hub airport projects in the region
 - b) common transport problems such as urban traffic congestion
 - c) transport-related problems depending on socio-economic factors
- He also said that there should be very good topics, excellent research leaders, cooperation and collaboration of domestic societies and funding. Through the newsletter, some topics could be solicited from leaders and researchers from member countries. Initial ICR activities could start at first in the voluntary level through discussions of leaders and their groups and if the expected output could be realized, funds could be provided for such researches.
- Mr. Lam proposed the making of a database of ongoing projects of member countries in order to identify key persons and research projects and facilitate communication and cooperation among researchers.
- The following research topics were proposed for international cooperative research by the Board of Directors :
 - future international container movements in the region
 - regional and sub-regional economic cooperation and integrated transport

system

- public-private sectors partnership (PPP) scheme
- Malaysia-Pusan railway project
- intermodal transportation system planning

6. Selection of EASTS logo

There were a total of 18 entries accepted by the secretariat but another entry (no. 19) was proposed to be formed combining two entries, no. 2 and no. 10, as suggested by the President Nakamura. This entry garnered the most number of votes. The results of the voting are as follows:

Combined entry no. 19 was nominated as the EASTS logo. After verifying for similar design all over the world, this logo will be announced by Newsletter as the official EASTS logo. Mr. Castro, who designed entry no. 2, and Mr. Regidor, who designed entry no. 10, both from the NCTS of the University of the Philippines, will each be awarded half of the total cash prize.

Minutes of the Board Meeting of the Eastern Asia Society for Transportation Studies

29-30 October 1997

Sheraton Walker Hill Hotel, Seoul, Korea

Part I : 29 Oct.(1330 to 1530 Hrs.)

1. Opening Remarks were given by President Hideo Nakamura.

2. The Participants introduced themselves. Mr. Morichi informed the absence of two representatives from China and Indonesia. Mr. Zhang Zhong Yi, member from China was unable to attend the second conference of the EASTS due to visa problem and Mr. Suyono Dikun from Indonesia would arrive the following day(Oct. 30). Mr. Morichi also announced the possibility of new membership from New Zealand, however, a representative from this country was not present in the Board meeting on 29 October. 12 Board members present and 8 support staffs introduced themselves.

3. The activities of the EASTS were reported by Secretary-General Shigeru Morichi.

- a) Development of Data Base on transportation related indices of each country was confirmed.
- b) A survey on Governmental Institute and Financing for Transportation Infrastructure was proposed by Secretary-General Morichi.
- c) The current state of International Cooperative Research Activity was reported. Only one project was proposed until now. It was confirmed that a well-organized group would be subsidized. Basic rule of subsidy would be decided depending on the EASTS's budget situation.

4. The procedure of paper selection for the 2nd Conference was reported by the International Scientific Committee (ISC) Chairman Hajime Inamura. 154 reviewed papers were printed in the Journal and 25 non-reviewed papers were printed in the Proceedings for the 2nd Conference. Mr. Morichi suggested that non reviewed/rejected papers should be included only as abstracts in the Conference Proceedings.

5. Current status of Each Domestic Society was reported.

- 1)Australia (Mr. Michael A.P. Taylor): National Committee on Transport (NCTR) is supporting the EASTS activities in Australia. Australia is category 2.

2)Hong Kong (Mr. William H.K. Lam): The Hong Kong Society for Transportation Studies (HKSTS) was established in 1996 with 9 Board members, and 40 regular members. The Society had organized the first conference and the second one will be held on 5 December 1997. Hong Kong is category 2.

3)Laos (Mr. Khanngun Khamvongsa):The LAOS-EASTS was established in 1997 with 15 permanent members at present. The Society has been organizing several seminars, workshops and has made several publications and newsletters. Due to lack of transportation experts, Mr. Khanngun Khamvongsa called for more support and cooperation from the EASTS and its member countries. Laos is category 1.

4)Malaysia (Mr. Mohamed Rehan Karim): The Transport Science Society of Malaysia (TSSM) was established with 13 executive committee members and 28 regular members. The Society had already organized the first general meeting and two workshops on transport modelling and transport planning. Malaysia is category 1.

5)Singapore (Mr. Tien Fang Fwa): The Society of Transportation Science (Singapore:STSS) was officially registered on 13 June 1997. Singapore is category 1.

6)Taiwan (Ms. Chia Pei Chou): The Chinese Institute of Transportation was established in 1985 with approximately 1,500 members. Taiwan is category 3

7)Thailand (Mr. Prapansak Buranaprapa): The Society is still waiting for the official approval from the Policy Department for the establishment of the Society. Thailand will be category 2.

8)Vietnam (Mr. Nguyen Xuan Dao): The Transport Science Society of Vietnam (TSSV) was established in December 1995. Vietnam is category 2.

9)Japan (Mr. Shigeru Morichi): The EASTS-Japan was established in 1995 with 370 members at present. Japan is category 4.

10)Philippines (Mr. Primitivo C. Cal): The Transportation Science Society of the Philippines was established in July 1993. Philippines is category 2.

11)Korea (Mr. Inwon Lee): The Korean Society of Transportation was established in 1981 with 1,016 members at present. Korea is category 3.

12) New Zealand(Mr. Glen Harrison, reported on 30 Oct.): Chartered Institute of Transport has several hundred members from academic, government and commercial sectors. It may act as the domestic society of the EASTS.

13)Indonesia(Mr. Suyono Dikun, reported on 30 Oct.): Indonesian Transport Society(ITS) was established with partnerships with private sectors and industries. Indonesia is category 2.

PART II: 30 Oct. (1200 to 1415 Hrs)

6. Report about the Awards of this conference was presented by Mr. Yoshitsugu Hayashi, chairman of the Awarding Sub-committee. He explained the process of awarding, eligibility criteria, evaluation criteria, and the awarding of winning papers. The papers for award approved during the board meeting are as follows:



Academic and research activities like the May 29 symposium and joint research as well as support activities such as support to the ISC and the EASTS homepage were discussed.

Membership (1,090 regular and 102 corporate members and 5 special members) was described. The organization constitution, officers, and journal were also discussed.

Taiwan by Mr. Yi John Sun

The 12th annual meeting with academic conference was held on December 20, 1997. Meetings, Intercollegiate Symposium on Transportation Studies and Seminar on Civil Aviation Policy were conducted.

Thailand by Mr. Prapansak Buranaprapa

Basic description of the organization was made especially membership criteria. Activities include seminars and conference with the Engineering Institute of Thailand in June 1998.

Vietnam by Mr. Nguyen Xuan Dao

Activities like research and projects at the state and ministry levels, training activities, quarterly magazine, and international cooperation were presented.







Minutes of 6th Board Meeting 1999

14-16 September 1999
3rd Conference in Taipei, Taiwan

14th September : 16:00-18:00 (2hrs)

The President called the meeting to order after the Secretary General certified the existence of a quorum.

Mr. Morichi, Secretary General of the EASTS, reported the reasons for the absence of Lao's board member and late arrival of the board member from Indonesia.

The Board appointed Former EASTS President, Mr. Nakamura, as President Emeritus.

(1) Report of the LOC

Mr. Y. J. Sun from the CIT reported on the final preparation for this conference and that the number of participants would be 349 persons from 21 countries.

(2) Closing Ceremony Program

Mr. Cal proposed that two sets of awards be given in this conference. One is for best paper and another is for special award of appreciation. The Board approved this proposal.

(3) Report of the ISC

Mr. Miyamoto, Chairman of the ISC, explained the guidelines for paper selection. The rate of acceptance is 66.5% (161/242) which is rather strict compared to the Seoul Conference (90.7%). He requested that board members promote paper submissions in the next conference. He also announced the publication of 6 books for Vol.3 of the EASTS Journal, consisting of 1 invited paper and 161 reviewed papers, and 1 book for Vol. 2 of the EASTS proceedings containing 34 non-reviewed papers.

Regarding the best paper selection, each session organizer nominated one or two papers based on review marks of the referees.

The President appreciated the efforts of the ISC chairman.

Mr. Ishida, Treasurer of the EASTS, likewise commended the ISC not only for the academic review but also on the financial viewpoint due to the saving in budget by virtue of the holding of ISC meetings through the Internet.

Mr. Morichi proposed the establishment of Yasoshima Prize explaining the personal history of Dr. Yasoshima, Professor Emeritus of the University of Tokyo, and background of the

proposal. The Yasoshima Prize, consisting of US\$1000, plaque, and certificate will be awarded to the selected paper. The Board approved the proposal.

(4) Report of the Domestic Societies

Australia by Mr. Taylor

He explained that Australia had undergone a major change in the system of taxation which has important implications on transportation such as taxation of public transportation fare. He also reported the publication of the "Transport Engineering in Australia" by the domestic society.

Hong Kong by Mr. S. C. Wong on behalf of Mr. Lam

HKSTS held two seminars in 1999 inviting Professor Yupo Chan from Air Force Institute of Technology in the US and Professor Hajime Inamura from Tohoku University in Japan as speakers. The HKSTS 3rd Conference was held on December 5, 1998 where around 150 persons attended. Planned activities of public lecture and conference in 1999 were also reported.

Japan by Mr. Morichi

Mr. Morichi reported that he was elected as president of EASTS-Japan. He also reported the activities of EASTS-Japan such as the holding of an international symposium, entitled "PPP for Transportation Projects in Asian Mega-Cities" in Tokyo on May 29, 1998 and 3 other seminars. Mr. Yai announced the plan of holding of JICA STRADA seminar. Additionally, Mr. Ishida, Treasurer of the EASTS-Japan, suggested that financial support for 4th Conference from EASTS-Japan will not increase due to the economic recession in Japan.

Korea by Mr. Inwon Lee

Mr. Lee reported the preparation for the WCTR in 2001 in Korea.

Mr. Oh reported the activities of the domestic society of Korea on behalf of Mr. Lee. Mr. Park, the chairman of Local Organization Committee of WCTR, reported the preparation for the conference in 2001.

Malaysia by Mr. Mohamed Rehan Karim

Mr. Karim reported that the TSSM conducted short courses on transport planning to professionals and government officials. Other activities include the preparation for the PIARC conference and revision of local standards in planning, design and construction in the Road Engineering Association of Malaysia.

New Zealand by Mr. Cris Kissling

Mr. Kissling reported the information dissemination about EASTS and joint activities with the Chartered Institute of Transport. He also said that the members of the domestic society are contributing to the PECC and APEC transportation working groups.

Philippines by Mr. Cal

Mr. Cal reported the holding of activities such as 6th annual conference of the TSSP, Urban Rail Summit, NCTS-TSSP symposium and Symposium on Aviation and Maritime



Transportation.

Taiwan by Mr. Sun on behalf of Mr. Feng

The executive secretary of the Taiwan LOC reported the activities of the CIT including the Seminar on Project Management of Highway and 1999 ISSOT Symposium and CIT's 8th Intercollegiate Symposium on Transportation Studies.

Vietnam by Mr. Dao

Mr. Dao reported that the name of society was changed from Transportation Science Society of Vietnam to Transportation Studies Society of Vietnam. He also reported the election of the officers and approval of by-laws. He also reported on the research program at state level, 5 projects at ministerial level, establishment of ITS group and scientific conference held on 28th of August, 1998 where 91 participants and 9 foreign guests attended.

China by Mr. Zhang

Mr. Zhang, as a representative of China Domestic Society, reported the structure of academic societies in transportation in China and other activities. In response to Mr. Nakamura's question on the issue of the establishment of the domestic society for EASTS in China, Mr. Zhang stated the difficult situation due to the size of China. Mr. Cal suggested the possibility to establish several societies for the EASTS to make it easier to disseminate information to researchers.

Indonesia by Mr. Subagio on behalf of Mr. Dikun

Mr. Subagio reported the situation for preparing a blueprint for transport sector policy and development programs for year 2000-2004.

Singapore by Mr. Fwa

Mr. Fwa explained the reason of the small number of members due to the Ph.D. qualification requirement. Activities include bi-monthly research seminars and the organization of the 6th International Conference on Applications of Advanced Technologies in Transportation Engineering in 2000.

Thailand by Mr. Prapansak

Mr. Prapansak reported the activities of the domestic society, such as ITS seminar, digital road map building project and road safety seminar.

(5) Report of the EASTS Activities

Mr. Yai reported the following EASTS Activities:

- Publication of Newsletters
- Updating of the EASTS Web Site

- International Cooperative Research Activities such as Incheon Airport Access study whose data was collected by KOTI and will be available for Airport Study Group.

Mr. Morichi informed the body on the President's program for future activities:

- Outstanding Transportation Project Award
- Best Domestic Society Award
- Transportation Landmark Photo Contest
- Publication of Annual Journal

The Outstanding Transportation Project Award was approved with Mr. Inwon Lee as chair of the committee.

The Best Domestic Society Award was likewise approved. Mr. Fwa was nominated and elected as chair of the Best Domestic Society Award Committee.

Proposal for Transportation Landmark Photo Contest was approved and Dr. Yai was elected as chair of the committee.

The chairs of the various committees would formulate guideline, selection process, etc. and report to the Board at its next meeting.

Regarding the proposed publication of the EASTS Journal between EASTS conferences, this was referred to the ISC for study. The ISC chair was likewise requested to render a report at the next Board Meeting in 2000.

(6) The 4th Conference

The Secretary General received three proposals for the 4th conference venue. These were Indonesia, Thailand and Vietnam. Each proponent explained the status of preparation.

The first voting of the EASTS Board was held to select the next conference venue. Vietnam was chosen by the majority of the Board Members. Vietnam got 25 votes over Indonesia and Thailand which got 2 votes each.

To avoid conflicts in schedule of other conferences, the date of the EASTS 4th conference was decided to be held on October 25 to 27, 2001 in Hanoi, Vietnam.

The request of the ISC Chairman, Mr. Miyamoto, that the technical session duration be extended from 2 days to 2 and half days, was approved by the Board.

(7) Proposed Amendment of the EASTS Constitution

Mr. Cal explained the proposed amendments after temporarily relinquishing chairmanship of the meeting to 1st Vice-President Inwon Lee.

Mr. Taylor proposed that the word "his" should be changed to "his/her". This was approved.

(7a) Proposed Amendment of the EASTS Constitution (part II)

Mr. Cal further explained the proposed amendments of the EASTS constitution (see attached Appendix 1). After clarifying sections 5.2 and 3.3, the Board approved the amendments.

(9) Treasurer's Report

Mr. Ishida presented the financial report for 1998-1999 (see Appendix 3). The Board approved the report. Mr. Cal and Mr. Lee inquired about the Yasoshima donation if it should be reflected as revenue and Mr. Ishida clarified that it is treated as a separate account since it is a donation to EASTS-Japan. Mr. Yai inquired about the ICRA fund (expenditure item g) and Mr. Ishida mentioned that the fund is available (approved budget) and asked the members to use it.

To lessen the financial infusion from EASTS-Japan, Mr. Cal suggested to consider as criterion for selection of conference host the amount that the potential host can contribute to EASTS in conducting the conference. He suggested other ways to generate revenues such as exhibit fees and sponsorships. He said that surplus, if any, should be divided between the local host and EASTS.

Mr. Dao affirmed the support of the local host in Hanoi for the next conference.

Mr. Ishida proposed the budget for 1999-2000 (see Appendix 3) and the board also approved the plan. He reminded the payment of annual dues from each domestic society. He also explained the difficulty in fund raising in Japan and requested each society to help in fund

raising.

Mr. Taylor suggested that an invoice be issued for annual dues.

(10) Election of Officers and Membership

President Cal noted that the term of the 2nd Vice-President had expired. The Secretary General explained that according to the constitution the representative of the next host, Mr. Nguyen Xuan Dao, shall automatically assume the 2nd Vice-Presidential post. Mr. Inwon Lee stated that it was a privilege serving the society in various capacities and now would like to relinquish his post as 1st Vice-President. The Board thanked him for his invaluable contributions and elected Mr. Cheng-Min Feng to assume the post of Vice-President.

Secretary-General Morichi asked Mr. Miyamoto to remain as chair of ISC. This was seconded by the other members of the Board.

Following new set of officers is as follows:

Minutes of 7th EASTS Board Meeting 2000

May 12, 2000
Le Port Kojimachi, JAPAN

The President called the meeting to order after the Secretary General certified the existence of a quorum.

Mr. Morichi, Secretary General of the EASTS, reported the reasons for the late arrival of the board member from Korea.

Prior to discussion of the first item on the Agenda, Mr. Cal reviewed the documents that were distributed as well as reminded the body that there should be 20 members of the Board. However, the three Directors-at-large will still be elected in Hanoi (Vietnam) in October 2001. He likewise welcomed the tentative members on be half of Board: Mr. Peter Hidas of Australia and Mr. C.O. Tong of Hong Kong.

The Agenda was amended with the presentation of the Domestic Societies moved to the last item and presented for approval.

1. Approval of Minutes of the last Board Meeting

The Minutes of the last Board Meeting held in Taipei (Taiwan) in September 1999 were approved without corrections.

2. EASTS Conference 2001 in Vietnam

Mr. Dao of Vietnam presented the organization, schedule, conference venue, and program for the EASTS 2001 Conference in Vietnam, on 24-27 Oct 2001. He introduced the various sponsoring international and local organizations as well as the proposed venue. He then proposed two topics for discussion and decision: theme for the conference and schedule of technical sessions. On the former, he put forth three suggestions:

- a) Developing transport for Developing countries/areas
- b) Developing transport for Developing East Asia
- c) Transport for Equity, Affordability and Mobility

After some discussion, topic C was chosen with modification: "Transport for Equity, Economy, Sustainability, and Mobility".

Moreover, the proposal to extend the conference duration from 2 days to 2.5 days was approved.

Mr. Dao also proposed the following topics for panel discussions:

- a) Transport Safety in Eastern Asia
- b) Financing for Maintenance and Development of the Transport Network

On the first topic, a query was made on whether this will include all modes. Furthermore, for the second topic, Mr. Cal suggested that 'Institutional Arrangement' be used instead of 'Financing'.

Mr. Morichi commended the selection of both proposed topics inasmuch as both issues are important to Vietnam. He further suggested that results of the panel discussions plus the recommendations must be presented to the public for general information.

Mr. Miyamoto, Chairman of the ISC, announced the following preferred deadlines for the next conference:

Call for Papers	May 31, 2000
Deadline for Submission of Abstracts	October 31, 2000
Notification of Acceptance of Abstracts	December 15, 2000
Submission of Draft of Full Paper	February 15, 2001
Notification of Acceptance of Paper	April 15, 2001
Submission of Full Paper	June 30, 2001

Camera ready papers must be sent to Hanoi for printing by August 31, 2001. Mr. Miyamoto likewise informed the body that there will be 6 books of the Proceedings for the 4th EASTS Conference and will include the reviewed papers as well as 1 invited paper.

Mr. Morichi emphasized that one of the main concerns that must be addressed is the procedure for the procurement of visa by each country/area.

Mr. Cal noted that the 4th EASTS Conference is expected only to break-even and he

suggested that it must be made profitable. Mr. Feng of Taiwan made several suggestions towards this end. He mentioned that product exhibits of potential sponsors be held as was done in Taiwan. He also urged Mr. Dao to reconsider the projected cost for printing the proceedings because from Taiwan's experience, the cost of the printing of the Proceedings was ten times more than the sales.

Another strategy put forward was the implementation of variable registration fees and Proceedings cost for members and non-members. Should the latter be implemented, Mr. Morichi suggested that the possibility of special discounted fees for participants supported by EASTS-Japan should be looked into. On this, Mr. Cal asked if it were possible for EASTS-Japan to just adjust the other subsidies for their beneficiaries instead of having three schedule of fees.

It was further suggested to look into the possibility of a group discount for EASTS 2001 Participants.

3. Amendments of the Constitution

Mr. Cal presented the highlights of the amended constitution. He explained the rational of an affiliate society: A country may have more than one transportation society, but only one may be admitted to EASTS as per the present constitution. So others may be accepted as affiliate members to increase cooperation and information exchanges. Guidelines on affiliate membership will be prepared by the Committee on Affiliate Societies headed by Mr. Valbuena of the Philippines.

- a) Composition of BOD – President or designated representative of Domestic society, Secretary-General, and Treasurer plus three Directors-at-large elected by the Representative Assembly.
- b) Membership
There are two categories of members in EASTS: Regular Members from Member Domestic Societies and Individual Members from countries/areas where domestic societies are not yet formed.

Each domestic society has four types of member: Board Member (its president or a designated representative), representative members as designated by the domestic society, regular international member (as designated by each

Domestic Society), and local members.

The number of representative members for each society will depend on its category as described below:

- Category 1: less than 25 International Members with annual fee of \$50
(1 representative)
- Category 2: 25 to 74 International Members with annual fee of \$300
(2 representatives)
- Category 3: 75-149 International Members with annual fee of \$2000
(4 representatives)
- Category 4: More than 149 International Members with annual fee of \$5000
(6 representatives)

Functions of the Representative Members would include election of Directors-at-large, ratification of any amendments to the Constitution, disposition of assets of EASTS, and other matters that are normally decided on by the general membership.

c) Voting

Mr. Cal stated that based on the amended constitution, one director is allowed one vote and will no longer be weighted by category. This is also true for the number of vote per representative. Should a representative be absent from the meeting of representatives, he may designate another person to vote in his stead.

It was emphasized by Mr. Cal that proxies are allowed only in meetings of the representatives but not in Board meetings.

It was mentioned by Mr. Cal International Members enjoy certain benefits. Moreover, ID cards will be issued to International members. On the query of Mr. Feng on the format of ID, Mr. Cal responded that it will be separate from the Domestic Society's ID card and since it will be issued by the Secretary-General's Office, format is uniform with possible two signatories: EASTS and Domestic Society he/she belong to.

Mr. Cal ended with a proposal to enter into formal agreements, either through Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) or Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with other international professional and scientific organizations to establish areas of cooperation such as exchange of journals and reduced conference fees, among others. If the body is agreeable with the proposal, draft MOA or MOU, would be presented during the next Board Meeting in Hanoi. Mr. Hayashi agreed with Mr. Cal's proposal and offered to bring up this proposal during the meeting of WCTR and discuss its merits.

4. Report of ISC

Mr. Miyamoto, Chairman of the ISC, informed the body that the ISC had already received several inquiries about the procurement of EASTS Proceedings and EASTS Journal through the Internet.

He then went on to discuss the proposal for new and separate publication for EASTS and he reiterated the following points:

- a) The new publication should not be called a journal to avoid confusion and must be independent from the EASTS Journal, thus must not contain any paper found in the Journal.
- b) The editorial board of the new publication must be independent from ISC.
- c) Publication must be every other autumn when no EASTS Conference is held.
- d) New publication may contain the following articles: invited papers, papers presented during EASTS Seminar on a special topic organized by a special interest group or key person/s, reports from members countries/areas on innovations, and results of panel discussions during the EASTS Conference.

Mr. Morichi asked whether calling the new publication a Journal will really create confusion. Mr. Cal suggested that the new publication, should it be decided that it will be called a journal, can easily be distinguishable from the EASTS Journal since volume numbers are indicated.

Mr. Dikun suggested that in as much as the current EASTS Journal already focuses on science and research, the new publication should focus on other matters such as the latest development in economy. He sought classification whether a domestic society could publish its own journal and he was answered in the affirmative.

Mr. Dao raised the issue on financing the new publication.

With all these various issues coming up, Mr. Ishida proposed that a preparatory committee should be established to look into the feasibility of issuing a new publication.

Mr. Cal proposed that the preparatory committee be a sub committee under the ISC.

Mr. Morichi asked the former ISC chairman, Mr. Inamura, to be the chairman of preparatory committee. Mr. Inamura agreed to be the chairman of the preparatory committee.

Mr. Hayashi was also requested by the body to support the preparatory committee and he agreed.

Mr. Cal suggested another option to expand the EASTS Newsletter to include not just news but also technical publications.

In closing, Mr. Miyamoto requested Mr. Kissling of New Zealand to join ISC inasmuch as each member country/area must be represented.

5. Activities of Ad-hoc committee

Best Domestic Society Award Committee

Mr. Fwa discussed the proposed terms of reference for the "Best EASTS Domestic Award" Committee as follows:

- Committee must be composed of a Board Member who will act as chair and two EASTS members appointed by the Board
- Awarding shall be during an EASTS Conference for maximum impact and publicity, based on activities of the society for the period since the previous EASTS Conference
- Committee shall propose the assessment criteria to the Board for approval
- Committee shall assess domestic societies in accordance with the approved assessment criteria and recommend the winner to the Board. He also suggested that the assessment should be based on the Society report

submitted to the Board.

- The decision of the Board shall be considered final

He proposed the following criteria: Intellectual Activities, Professional Activities, Social Activities, Members' Participation Rate, Impact of Activities, and Benefits for the Members. Details will be provided later after the Board has appointed the two additional members for the Committee.

Mr. Dikun raised the matter on the varying stages of development of domestic societies. Mr. Cal said that it was once considered that two categories based on period of existence and size be used. But no decision was reached at that time. One possibility is to create a mechanism such that no domestic society may receive the Award for successive periods.

Mr. Rehan of Malaysia and Mr. Kissling of New Zealand were appointed to assist Mr. Fwa in the Committee.

Photo Contest Committee

Salient points of Mr. Yai's report were as follows:

- Use of newsletter to announce new activity. Deadline will be next summer.
- Formation of a sub-committee for photo selection
- Photos will be displayed at the Conference venue and selection will be by voting
- Organizing committee is requested to distribute voting sheet at the beginning of the conference
- Sub-committee will discuss the selection method later
- Final approval will be by the board. Notification of winners will be thru the Newsletter
- Selection criteria is still to be determined. A nominal prize subject to funds available is considered.
- Encourage members with special ability in photography
- Must decide how best to show case the winning photo

A query was made on whether all photos be on display. Mr. Yai said that it depends on space and time available for selection. At this time, no specific details yet. Domestic societies may suggest members for the committee or invitation will be issued through

the newsletter.

Affiliate Societies Committee

Mr. Cal reported that Mr. Valbuena, chair of the Affiliate Society Committee, could not make it due to conflicts in schedule. However, a questionnaire has been handed out to the Board members to be filled out later by each domestic society and send to TSSP or to Mr. Cal. Even domestic societies with no affiliate societies are still urged to complete the questionnaire.

Outstanding Transportation Project Award Committee

The committee is tasked to recognize outstanding performance in carrying out of a transportation project. The committee is chaired by Mr. Lee from Korea. The body was informed that Mr. Lee would be arriving by late afternoon.

6. International Cooperative Research Activity

Mr. Yai reported that there is no special international cooperative research activity at this point in time.

7. Treasurer's Report

Mr. Ishida presented the financial report for 1999-2000.

For the annual dues, \$6000 was collected but it should be \$11,100. He urged member countries to pay annual dues.

Mr. Ishida expressed appreciation for the hard work of ISC.

Mr. Ishida pointed out that though fund for the "International Cooperative Research Activity" was set up since the beginning of EASTS, this amount (about \$30,000/year) was never used due to some difficulties. He encouraged wider information dissemination to stimulate international research activity. But he stressed that clear selection criteria must be set by the President, two vice-presidents and Secretary General.

Mr. Dikun expressed the need for more specific procedure for applying for the fund.

Identification of common issue/interest of the various domestic societies must be undertaken and the possibility of consolidated research proposal was introduced.

It was suggested that to facilitate the payment of annual dues by Domestic Societies, EASTS must send a formal letter indicating the assessment of annual dues to each member country/area.

The Board approved the financial report.

8. Report of Domestic Societies

Australia

Mr. Hidas presented the summary of the Activities of the Australian National Committee on Transport (NCTR). The first portion of the report was an enumeration of the objectives of NCTR. The second portion highlights the activities for year 1999. These include:

- launching of the NCTR website;
- organization and coordination of the visit of UK Prof. George Hazel of Robert Gordon University to mainland capital cities;
- formulation of new Institution draft policy on sharing the benefits from transport reform;
- updating of existing Institution policies on transport demand management and road safety;
- commission of new discussion papers on (1) urban and intercity freight, (2) airport planning and operations and (3) the impacts of transport as a public issue;
- continuation and intensification of the committee's national collaboration with other transport related professional societies as well as its international collaboration with EASTS;
- major contribution to the Institution's submission to the Australian Senate Select Committee on a new taxation system for Australia;
- continued production of the journal *Transport Engineering in Australia* and fostering of informed debate on transport issues through the publication of journal of discussion papers and commentaries on those papers.

Future activities include:

- joint organization with the Australian Institute of Traffic Planning and Management (AITPM) of a international transport conference to be held on the Gold Coast in June 7-9, 2000;
- calling for nominations for the National Transport Engineering Medal, to be presented at the Gold Coast conference;

China

Mr. Zhang informed the body that EASTS China is not yet established. However, there are several transportation societies that hold pertinent activities. In the past year, members of these organizations often gather together for seminars and idea exchanges mainly on transportation and infrastructure. There are about two or three local groups, in Beijing and in Shanghai.

Mr. Cal encouraged the establishment of the society.

Hong Kong

Mr. C.O. Tong reported that Hong Kong Transportation Society (HKTS) organized the following seminars:

- "An Analytical Framework of Air Pollution Based on the Input-Output Analysis", by Prof. Hajime Inamura, Tohoku University, Japan
- "Strategy and Targets for Road Safety – British Experience and Prospects 1980-2010" by Prof. Richard Allsop, University College London, UK
- "Efficient Design of Integrated Urban Public Transport Networks", by Prof. Avi Ceder, Israel Institute of Technology, Israel
- "Development of a Mesoscopic Traffic Simulation Model", by Prof. Michael Florian, University of Montreal, Canada
- "Risk Aversity in Traffic Assignment: A Game Theory Approach", by Prof. Michael G.H. Bell, University of Newcastle

Moreover, HKSTS organized the Fourth Conference of Hong Kong Society for Transportation Studies and Workshop on Public Transportation.

The 5th Conference of Hong Kong Society for Transportation Studies will be held on December 2, 2000.

HKTS is also currently upgrading their web site and proposed that all the websites of

the Domestic Societies be linked as well as linked to EASTS website.

Mr. Cal commended this proposal.

Indonesia

Mr. Dikun presented the past activities of the Masyarakat Transportasi Indonesia (MTI) which included several executive discussions. He particularly - Highlighted the Transport 2000 Forum, a serial discussion and forum from May - September 1999 to discuss the future directions of transport policies and programs in the year 2000 and beyond. As a result of Transport 2000 Forum, MTI was able to publish Transport Policy Reforms Statement and submitted it to government.

He also informed the body that an additional 4 chapters have been established in Jakarta, West Java, Jogjakarta, and Bali province.

Forthcoming activities include an International Seminar Role of Transport Infrastructure in Indonesian Economic Recovery and the New Economic Platform to be held in July 2000. They are also currently developing Transport Data and Research Center in cooperation with JICA. He concluded his presentation with an offer to host the 5th EASTS Conference.

Mr. Cal appreciated Indonesia's offer to host 5th EASTS Conference and assured that this will be kept in mind for the next board meeting.

Japan by Mr. Ishida for Mr. Morichi

Mr. Ishida presented the report of EASTS-Japan in behalf of Mr. Morichi. He presented the list of officers as well as the size of membership (388 regular members, 17 student members, 49 cooperate members and 17 supporting members. He emphasized that the latter two categories of members are the sponsors of EASTS. However, he reiterated that due to the recent economic crisis, the number of corporate members has been decreasing.

He also mentioned that in the past year, EASTS-Japan have conducted 3 seminars including one on "Evaluation of JICA STRADA and its improvement in the future".

Korea

Submitted after the meeting.

Lao

Mr. Khamvongsa reported that the Society has actively participated in formulating an agreement for the facilitation of goods in transit which has already been signed by the ASEAN member countries. He stressed that at present they lack skilled manpower in all level since LAO-EASTS is still very young. He seeks cooperation and support for the development of the transport sector in Lao PDR.

Malaysia by Mr. Mohamed Rehan Karim

Mr. Rehan reported that TSSM's activities for the past year have just been the continuation of similar activities for the past several years. However, he mentioned that the Public Lecture and Seminar series seem attract more serious discussions on transportation issues and thus has been made into a monthly activity.

TSSM is currently working on the publication of the Malaysian Journal of Transportation which he hopes will be out by the end of this year. Future activities include the Malaysian Transportation Conference planned for next year.

New Zealand by Mr. Cris Kissling

Mr. Kissling mentioned that most of the members of EASTS in New Zealand are members of NZPECC Transportation Forum group. To date, they have not yet convened under the banner of EASTS. However, individual undertakings include a distance learning programme for professionals on Professional Studies which includes specialization in Transport Management.

He put forth nomination of Mr. Robin Dunlop, General Manager of Transit New Zealand, for membership in ISC to replace Mr. Phil McDermott.

He informed the body that at this time no dues are collected for becoming a member of the EASTS.

Philippines

Mr. Cal presented Transportation Science Society of the Philippines (TSSP)'s report in behalf of Mr. Valbuena. He reported that TSSP has more than 100 regular members but the source of funding for the Society comes from the Corporate members who are representatives of companies. Corporate members pay annual dues of \$250 whereas

regular members pay only \$25. Associate members are students who are taking post graduate studies. TSSP requires that a member should have at least a master's degree or a bachelor's degree with publications.

Past activities include the joint sponsoring of symposia on maritime and aviation issues. The 7th TSSP was also held in Cebu City with participants from EASTS-Japan.

Future activities include Aviation 2000 Seminar in June to tackle policy of government on air services agreement.

He concluded his report with an invitation for everyone to attend the 8th TSSP Conference to be held in July 2000.

Singapore by Mr. Fwa

Mr. Fwa reported that most of their Society's activities have been research related. The Society conducts research seminars once every two months coinciding with council meeting. Past activities included the sponsoring of "International Conference on Public Transit in the 21st Century".

Future activities will focus on Intelligent transport and will include the sponsoring of the "6th International Conference on Applications of Advanced Technologies in Engineering" in June 2000.

Taiwan by Mr. Feng

Mr. Feng mentioned that Chinese Institute of Technology (CIT) has about 500 members. Past activities included conferences on Transportation Networks and Transportation Safety, annual meeting during year-end with panel discussions on Public Transport, Impact of WTO on Transport Sector, and Earthquake Considerations on Transportation.

Mr. Feng was re-elected as Chairman of CIT for another 2-year term.

Thailand

Mr. Prapansak presented the Society's set of officers, criteria for membership, and the number of members (127) broken down as follows: regular members – 56, Corporate members – 4, student members – 67. Past activities included seminars on ITS and Road Safety Audit.

Vietnam

Mr. Duc informed the body that TSSV is concentrating all its efforts on the organization

of the forthcoming EASTS Conference. Past activities also included cooperating with the Ministry of Transport on the first draft of ITS deployment master plan for Vietnam as well as implementation of the road management capacity improvement. TSSV also prepared the technical road code of Vietnam.


9. Other matters


- Mr. Kissling requested that the extension of his email in the directory be changed from "ec" to "ac".

Minutes of EASTS 2001 Board Meeting in Hanoi

The President called the meeting to order after the Secretary General certified the existence of a quorum.

Mr. Chon from Korea and Mr. Khammoune BOUAPHANH from LAO PDR were introduced as new members.

24 October (Wed.), 2:00-4:00 PM (Reporting)

(1) Approval of Agenda

President asked the members on any additional matters to discuss. There was no response and therefore, no additional matters for discussion.

(2) Approval of the Minutes of the Meeting in May 2000

Mr. Cal asked for the approval of the minutes of the Board Meeting in Tokyo in May 2000. There were no corrections requested and therefore, the minutes was approved.

(3) Activities Report of the Local Organizing Committee (LOC)

Mr. Dao reported on the activities of LOC. He expressed his appreciation to the Board Members.

The President explained the financial situation of the conference activities and suggested to raise funds.

Mr. Dikun said that it would be better to put this matter in the conference report for discussion in the next conference.

All members of the Board appreciated Mr. Dao for organizing this big international conference.

(4) Report of the International Scientific Committee (ISC)

Mr. Miyamoto reported on the activities of the ISC including the paper selection procedures, results of selection and publication. The ISC is also planning to apply the EASTS Journal for inclusion in the ISI.

- Mr. Dikun inquired on the measures, which is more convenient to collect the papers than the Internet, because of Virus. However, in this time it is too



difficult to change the all process. ???

- Mr. Morichi also inquired on the status of the participants from non-Asian countries/areas and on the possibility of granting of the individual membership for them. This matter was decided to be examined by the Membership Committee.

(5) Preliminary Committee Reports

Outstanding Transport Project Awarding: Mr. Inwon LEE

The members of committee are, all Directors-at-Large (3): Mr. Inwon Lee, Mr. Hajime Inamura, and Mr. Lawrence W. Lan, and Mr. William H. K. Lam (Hong Kong) Mr. Khammoune Bouaphanh (LaoPDR), Mr. Prapansak Buranapraba (Thailand), and Mr. Nguyen Xuan Dao (Vietnam).

Mr. Lee reported that the meeting of the Committee on the Outstanding Transport Project Award would be held in the afternoon of October 24.

Best Domestic Society: Mr. Tien Fang FWA

Mr. Karim and Mr. Kissling are assisting Mr. Fwa who is the Chair of the committee.

They reported that voting would be held on October 25 lunchtime.

The criteria for the award as set by the committee are announced. (as published earlier in the EASTS Newsletter)

Mr. Inamura suggested to normalize the weights of the participating domestic societies.

Mr. Morichi also suggested that the big activities of a big society and the small activities of a small society should be evaluated from different points of view.

Photo Contest: Mr. Tetsuo YAI

Mr. Yai proposed for the cancellation of the photo contest because there were only 3 entries submitted to the committee..

Mr. Morichi suggested that in the next conference, the contest should be promoted in other societies in the world.



October 25 (Thurs.), 12:00-2:00 PM (Discussion)

President Cal welcomed Ms. Nisarad Adsawapornwasin and Mr. Ikuo Harazaki from the Bangkok RAI, who extended invitation to member domestic societies to participate in Inter-traffic 2002 Asia, International Forum for Design, Management, Maintenance and Constriction of Traffic and Transport Infrastructure, to be held in Bangkok on 12-14 June 2002.

(6) Relationship Between Other International Organizations/ Societies

Mr. Rene Santiago (President of the TSSP), on behalf of Mr. Cesar Valbuena, who is Chairperson of the Committee on Affiliate Societies, reported on the findings based on the responses from five member domestic societies, excluding the Philippines. He said that EASTS might consider two types of affiliate organizations: "participant" affiliate or "formal" affiliate.

The President invited Mr. Godard Xavier from CODATU to brief the Board on the activities of their society. Mr. Xavier, in reply to a query from Mr. Morichi, said that the next conference of CODATU would be in 2005. The President asked if there is any difference in registration fees of members and non-members. Mr. Xavier replied that as of present, there is no difference but they are considering different fees in their future conferences. Mr. Morichi asked if CODATU is publishing journals. Mr. Xavier answered that they are publishing electronically through web sites. Mr. Dikun asked on the philosophy of CODATU with respect to urban transportation. Mr. Miyamoto added that he has attended several conferences and chaired some technical sessions of the CODATU and it is functioning as one of the special interest groups of the World Conference on Transport Research Society (WCTRS). He suggested that EASTS could enter into mutual cooperation agreement with CODATU in the future.

Mr. Cal said that the issue before the body was whether or not EASTS should admit affiliate societies and how. As the works of the Membership Committee is related to the issue, he invited Mr. Morichi, chair of the Membership Committee, to present its activities. Mr. Morichi indicated that the Society would like to involve Cambodia in the next conference, noting that Mr. Yai and the President have made initial efforts in involving experts in that country. He also reported that the number of experts in



transportation in Lao PDR and Myanmar is still limited and encouraged an increase in the level of activities. Mr. Morichi appealed to each domestic society to upgrade its category and pay its annual dues. With regards to the issuance of identification cards to regular members that was agreed in the 2000 Board Meeting in Tokyo, Mr. Morichi reported that as of this moment, there is still no list of members of the Society since some of the member lists sent by the domestic societies contain local scripts which could not be understood by the Secretary-General's Office. He further stated that only 10% of the total conference cost is supported by revenues coming from the annual dues. Due to the worsening economic situation, the support of EASTS from the private sector in Japan could become a problem in the future. He cited Hong Kong and Singapore, where transportation is a major industry and called on the Board Members from these countries/areas to try to involve the private sector in the Society.

Mr. Morichi then moved on to the issue of individual membership and expansion of the regional coverage of the EASTS. He mentioned 6 countries/areas for possible expansion of the EASTS regional coverage that includes North Korea, Russia (Far East Russia), and Mongolia at the first stage, and Bangladesh, Nepal and Bhutan at the second stage. He said that if Bangladesh would be included, there would be no reason not to include Pakistan, so the boundary of EASTS should be carefully decided. Mr. Inamura suggested that the first stage countries, i.e. North Korea, Russia (Far East) and Mongolia could be considered as falling within the existing regional coverage of EASTS. The President then read on the section of the Constitution that defines the boundary or coverage. Mr. Taylor proposed to add two Pacific countries, namely Fiji and Papua New Guinea as also falling within the boundary. The President then summed up the discussion by concluding that the Board would accept Mr. Inamura's interpretation and Mr. Taylor's proposal and outside this coverage, participation could be through affiliate societies. Mr. Dikun added that there would be an implication in costs in adding new country/area members to the Society. Mr. Kissling expressed support for the involvement of participants outside the EASTS regional coverage on an individual basis and with this, the Society could observe the status of other organizations and could also let other organizations to observe EASTS activities for mutual interests. He also expressed support in keeping the regional coverage, but allowing the participation of individual members outside the coverage.

The President called for a decision on the issues of affiliate societies and admission of individual members from outside the geographical coverage of EASTS. On the



suggestion of Mr. Morichi, it was decided to refer those to the Membership Committee for further study and to report to the Board at its meeting in 2002.

(7) Discussion of Best EASTS Domestic Society Award

Mr. Fwa reported on the results of evaluation. He clarified that the evaluation was confined on the documents submitted by each domestic society, noting that these documents did not contain the required information. Mr. Kissling, a member of the Best Domestic Society Award Committee, added that on one criterion, all member domestic societies obtained a mark of "0" due to the absence of information. The committee finally recommended the Chinese Institute of Transportation (CIT) in Taiwan as the recipient of the award and subsequently approved by the Board. Mr. Feng, 1st Vice-President and Chair of the CIT, thanked the committee and the Board for the award.

(8) Report on Outstanding Transportation Project Award

Mr. Lee, chair of the Outstanding Transportation Project Award Committee, reported on the awarding of the outstanding transport project.

Results of the discussion of the sub-committee yielded several candidates for this award. Mr. Lee then asked how many outstanding awards will be given. President Cal suggested that there should only be one outstanding award.

(9) Selection of the International Cooperative Research Activity (ICRA)

Mr. Yai asked the members of the Board to see the documents of the ICRA preview process and the results of the preliminary evaluation of EASTS Japan. He explained that he made the 4 indices for evaluation. The four indices were 1) Internationality, 2) Academic/Practical Novelty, 3) Usefulness and 4) Prospect. He reported that the following two proposals were selected based on the results of evaluation by 7 professors.

- 1) A Comparison Study on Motorcycle Traffic Development in Some Asian Countries – Case of Vietnam, Malaysia and Taiwan
- 2) Travel Behavior Analysis and Its Implication to Urban Transport Planning for



Developing Countries

The Board approved the above two project proposals for ICRA.

Mr. Yai finally announced that the results of these 2 studies would be presented in next conference in a special session.

(10) Selection of the Venue of the 5th Conference

Mr. Dikun proposed Bali as the 5th conference venue and presented the status of the preparation for the conference.

Mr. Morichi proposed Fukuoka City as the venue for the 5th Conference and Mr. Takamatsu, officer of Fukuoka City Government, presented their proposal to the Board. Based on the results of the voting, Fukuoka was selected by the Board as the venue for the 5th Conference of the EASTS.

26 October (Fri.), 7:30-9:30 AM (Discussion and Conclusion)

(11) Conference Prize

Mr. Miyamoto reported on the meetings of the ISC

Mr. Reynaldo B. VEA, Chairperson of the Award Sub-Committee, reported on the selection of the outstanding papers.

The Board approved the selection of outstanding papers by the Award Sub-Committee.

(12) Final Selection of Awards

Mr. Lee reported that their committee selected Incheon International Airport for the Outstanding Transportation Project Award. The Board approved the award.

(13) Selection of the Venue of the 5th Conference

Fukuoka was selected as the venue for the 5th Conference.

Mr. Cal, EASTS President, thank Mr. Yamasaki, Major of Fukuoka City, and Mr. Chishaki, chairman of the executive committee for EASTS Fukuoka Conference, for their kind support for the seminar and Conference. Mr. Yamasaki thank the Board Members for coming to Fukuoka and for selecting Fukuoka as the venue for the conference in 2003.

1. Approval of the Minutes of the Hanoi Board Meeting

Mr. Cal formally opened the EASTS Board Meeting. There were no corrections raised and therefore, the Minutes of the EASTS Board Meeting in Hanoi, Vietnam were deemed approved.

2. ISC Reports

Mr. Satoh, Chair of the ISC, reported the following changes in relation to the 5th EASTS Conference in Fukuoka in 2003:

- 1) proceedings shall be published in CD ROM
- 2) paper review policy
 - high quality paper review without decreasing the number of papers

Mr. Tamura, staff of the ISC, took over from Mr. Satoh, and reported the details of the update report from the ISC, highlights of which were:

Awards Sub-Committee

Prof. Hitoshi Ieda of the University of Tokyo takes over from Mr. Kim as chair of the committee.

ISC Membership

There were 32 committee members as of that date. There were still no members from Hong Kong and the request for the Board to recommend a person from Hong Kong was reiterated.

Current Status of Preparation

Mr. Tamura reported on the current status of ISC preparations for the EASTS 2003 Conference in Fukuoka, referring to the written report of the ISC.

Recommendation of EASTS Journal to the ISI

Mr. Miyamoto, past Chair of the ISC, was currently in the process of recommending the EASTS Journal for inclusion in ISI.

Issues for Clarification, Suggestions and Requests

After the report of Mr. Tamura, Mr. Cal requested clarification on some items of the ISC report.

Mr. Cal inquired on the progress of the application to ISI of Mr. Miyamoto, former chair of the ISC. Mr. Tamura replied that the materials for application were already prepared and sent to the office of the ISI in July 2002. In August 2002, the ISI staff requested further details on the submitted materials.

With regards to the request to the Board to recommend a member for ISC from Hong Kong, Mr. Cal asked the representative from Hong Kong, Mr. Hau, to consider the request of the ISC when he goes back to Hong Kong.

4. 2003 EASTS Conference in Fukuoka City, Japan

Mr. Cal invited the Chair of the Executive Committee Mr. Chisaki and staff to explain the preparations and logistics for the EASTS 2003 Conference in Fukuoka. Mr. Sumi, staff of the Executive Committee, showed the organizational structure of the Executive Committee and then explained the theme and background of the conference.

Theme of the Conference

Mr. Cal indicated that it is customary for the Board to confirm the theme of the conference, and invited the Board Members to confirm or give some comments on the proposed theme "Connecting Asia for Better Transportation".

pn

Mr. Cal proposed to change the theme, without changing the general spirit, to "Connecting Asia Through Better Transportation". Mr. Dao reacted and asked how about countries such as Australia and New Zealand. Mr. Cal then asked Mr. Taylor for comment. Mr. Taylor then suggested the theme "Connecting Asia-Pacific Through Better Transport". Mr. Fen suggested that a broader term be used. Mr. Inamura supported the word "Asia-Pacific" in the theme. Mr. Cal wrapped up the discussion by suggesting the theme "Connecting Eastern Asia Through Better Transportation".

5. Report of the Secretary-General

Mr. Yai, Secretary-General of the EASTS, updated the Board on the activities of the Society. Aside from the preparation for the Board Meeting, the major task had been the improvement of the EASTS Web Site, with updates every 2 weeks.

Suggestions for Dissemination of Information on Local Conferences

Mr. Inamura recommended that the Secretary-General coordinate with the domestic societies with regards to conferences organized at the local level. Mr. Feng asked if it is possible to find information on local conferences being organized. Mr. Cal then said that the points are well taken and suggested that the announcement of sponsored conferences should also be disseminated to members of the Society as they might be interested in attending these conferences. Furthermore, Mr. Cal said that all requests for sponsorship must pass through the Domestic Society Member except for China where the Secretary-General and the President would decide.

6. Report of the Treasurer

Mr. Ishida, Treasurer of the EASTS, thanked the Board for his re-election and reported the finances of the Society from April 2001 to March 2002.

7. Report of International Membership Identification Card (ID)

Mr. Vergel of the Secretariat presented the proposal for the international membership identification card.

Mr. Morichi stressed that the two most important benefits are the recognition of excellent papers and the collaboration with other experts. Information that should be put in the ID should be field of study and more important, the field of specialization.

Mr. Chon asked if the Society will set the number of individual members from each domestic society, citing the case of the domestic society in Korea where there are 1,300 members. Mr. Cal answered that the number of international members must not exceed the limit set by the category of membership. Mr.

Chon expressed worry since they have many members. Mr. Morichi said that the registration fee of EASTS is cheaper compared to other societies. The Board then finally decided to adopt the centralized scheme of issuance of the international membership identification card.

Mr. Yai presented a timetable for the implementation of the international membership ID.

8. Report of Domestic Societies

The Board decided to have a working lunch and the report of each domestic society was heard ahead of the report of the various committees.

9. Report of the Standing Committees

After the report from domestic societies, reports and or updates from 5 committees were heard by the Board.

9.1 Membership Committee

Mr. Lee, Chair of the Membership Committee, reported on the activities of the membership committee.

Update on North Korea

Mr. Morichi provided an update on the communications with North Korea. He found out that the constraint is absence of English-speaking transport expert. On March 2002, he coordinated with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) of Japan and the MFA replied that there is no problem in communicating with experts in North Korea. Another chance would be the November 2002 summit. If the summit between leaders of Japan and North Korea will be successful, the second trial will be after the summit. There are 3 requirements for expert coming from North Korea:

- 1) English-speaking;
- 2) Must be an expert; and,
- 3) Visit to conference must be beneficial for himself.

Issues That Needed to be Studied by the Membership Committee

Mr. Cal summarized and recommended the following issues that should be studied by the membership committee:

- 1) Individual membership of countries outside the geographical area as raised by Mr. Morichi; and,
- 2) In the last Board Meeting held in Hanoi, the Philippines made a report on the issue of affiliate societies. If a Memorandum of Agreement

would be made with societies outside the geographical coverage of EASTS, what should be the terms of such an agreement?

9.2 Best Transportation Landmark Photo Contest Committee

There was no update from the Landmark Photo Contest Committee. Mr. Morichi said that Mr. Prapansak, Chair of this committee, must be informed on what are needed to be done by this committee.

Time-Series Photo of Cities

Mr. Morichi encouraged members to provide time-series photo of their cities. He recommended that Mr. Prapansak should open the photo contest to other societies in the world. Mr. Yai said that there is no idea on the use of the photograph after the contest aside from displaying them on the web or newsletter. Mr. Morichi suggested that one idea is to publish a book that will show how an area developed terms of transportation, which is very good for the education of students.

9.3 Best EASTS Domestic Society Award Committee

Mr. Feng, Chair of the Best EASTS Domestic Society Award Committee, presented the proposed terms of reference and proposed selection criteria based on solicited comments from the past Chair Mr. Fwa. Four domestic societies (Japan, Korea, Taiwan and the Philippines) are competing and said that criterion no. 4 is quite difficult to assess due to lack of information. Mr. Rehan said that they did not receive information on this matter. Mr. Cal said that the participation rate is difficult to estimate since it is difficult to find the base. Mr. Hau suggested to base it on the active member rate. Mr. Fwa said it would be difficult to use the number of active members as the base. Mr. Cal proposed a weighting system. Mr. Fwa said that without criterion no. 4, the remaining 5 can differentiate the candidates. Mr. Cal proposed that the remaining 5 items be adopted.

Mr. Morichi proposed to adopt qualitative criterion citing the example of Singapore with many conferences organized although the domestic society is small. Qualitative description can be attached such as learning from each other. Mr. Cal, in reference to Mr. Morichi's proposal, proposed to describe each criterion and give the committee a leeway in deciding instead of a fixed 20% weight per criterion.

9.4 International Cooperative Research Activity (ICRA)

Mr. Yai presented an update on the cooperative research activities of the ICRA. He said that the researchers in the on-going ICRA projects were asked to present in a special session in the Fukuoka EASTS Conference in 2003. Details of the session will be determined as discussions with the ISC and the

LOC will still be conducted. As of present, a special session was already requested.

10. Other Matters

SIG on the Environment

Mr. Morichi updated the Board with regards to the project on the environment with the OECD based on the information from Professor Hayashi of Nagoya University. Mr. Fwa has a similar project on the environment. They would like to start a special interest group (SIG) on the environment, and if the Board agreed, Mr. Morichi would like to ask Mr. Fwa and Mr. Hayashi to start an SIG on the environment. Mr. Fwa informed the Board that they had organized a conference on transport and the environment.

One Decade of the EASTS, 1994-2004

Mr. Morichi reminded the Board that after the Fukuoka Conference, the Society will celebrate its 10th anniversary in 2004. The first board meeting was held in Japan in 1994. Mr. Morichi solicited ideas from the Board on what kind of activities that would be done during the celebration. Initial proposals include publishing of a book, review of activities of the Society or a book containing photographs. Deadline for suggestions will be until the EASTS Fukuoka Conference.

Establishment of a Domestic Society in China

During the Board Meeting in Hanoi in 2001, Mr. Morichi proposed to establish a regional society in mainland China since the country is big. Today, the Society received information that a national society was organized in China and therefore brings back the issue of whether to set up a national or several regional societies. He asked the representative from China, Mr. Mingqing, to consult this issue with his colleagues.

Audit of Financial Records of the Society

Mr. Morichi informed the Board that the auditor of EASTS-Japan has requested an audit of the finances of EASTS since it has provided financial support to participants in the past 4 conferences. He asked the Board on how the Society can accommodate such request. Mr. Cal constituted a group composed of the secretary-General, the Treasurer and himself to look into this, as well as the matter of registration of EASTS as a juridical person.

Revenue Generation for Financial Sustainability

Mr. Morichi said that due to the economic recession that Japan was currently experiencing, the private sector was considering to withdraw its support to EASTS-Japan, which is the main donor of EASTS. EASTS-Japan had tried

its best to explain to its sponsors to keep the international activities although it had been noted that the number of corporate sponsors had gone down.

Mr. Morichi suggested that corporate members of domestic societies become international corporate members of the EASTS by applying through the domestic societies since it would be difficult for the Society to deal with the corporations directly. In relation to this, Mr. Cal suggested to pursue the corporate membership within the EASTS, citing the case of the domestic society in the Philippines, the TSSP, where there are already Philippine companies working outside the Philippines.

As a follow-up to the discussion, Mr. Cal suggested that a proportion of the earnings from EASTS conferences should be allocated to EASTS. Guaranteed share of EASTS from conference earning may even be used as a criterion in selecting conference venue.

Mr. Morichi brought up the idea of introducing another category of membership known as "Fellow" in other professional associations. He said that Fellows in these associations pay much higher dues than regular members. Mr. Rehan commented that such is the case in Malaysia.

Mr. Cal wraps up the discussion by asking the Treasurer, Secretary-General and the Membership Committee to form a special committee to look into the idea of introducing the "Fellow" as another category of membership.

11. Adjournment

The President adjourned the meeting by thanking the Office of the Secretary-General and EASTS-Japan for the management and support of the 2002 EASTS Board Meeting in Fukuoka.

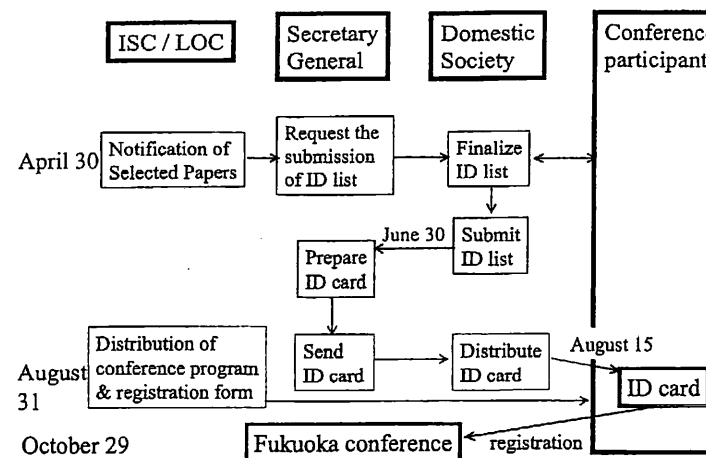

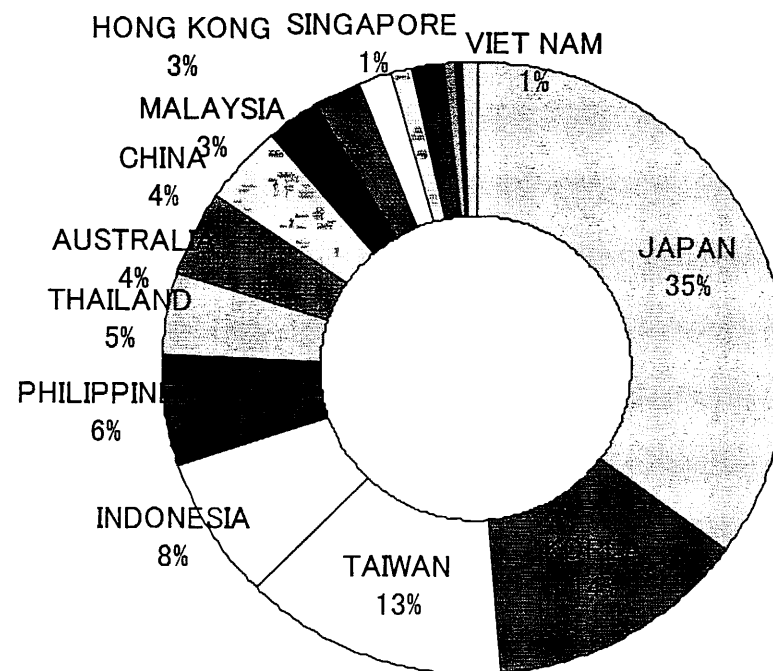
No. of Technical Papers

INTRODUCTION

In support of the activities of EASTS, a group of interest researchers in Singapore initiated the formation of a domestic society to promote the study and research of transportation related issues in early 1995. After two years of preparation, the SOCIETY OF TRANSPORTATION SCIENCE (SINGAPORE), or STSS in short, was officially registered in Singapore on 13 June 1997.

The society's objective is to provide a forum for transport researchers and professionals to exchange ideas and information on transportation science. The main activities of the society have been organising R&D seminars and conferences. About 10 research seminars are organised every year.

MEMBERSHIP

Considering the other discipline-specific societies already in existence in the transportation sector in Singapore, STSS identified its main role to be research oriented, focussing on interaction with overseas research institutions and organizations. It was on this understanding that the criteria of membership were set as follows:

A holder of PhD degree in transportation or transportation-related discipline from a recognized university; or

A holder of a Master's degree transportation or transportation-related discipline from a recognized university, having published at least 2 technical papers and at least 5 years of professional experience; or

A transportation professional with more than 10 years relevant working experience, having published at least 2 technical papers.

STSS does not collect any fees from members. Admission fees or annual membership fees are required to be members.

Membership number has fluctuated between 10 and 20 over the years. The current number of members stands at 13.

ACTIVITIES

Research Seminars

STSS organises regular research seminar once every two months to coincide with its Council Meeting. Additional research seminars are held whenever there are lectures by visitors or special guests. On the average, about 10 to 15 research seminars have been held every year. The table below summarizes the number of seminars organized by STSS since its formation.

Conferences

The following conferences have been organized by STSS since 1997:

- (1) 1st Asia Pacific Conference on Transportation and the Environment, 13-15 May 1998, Singapore. An exhibition was held in conjunction with the conference at the same venue. Supporting organisations for the event included the Ministry of the Environment, Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore, Land Transport Authority, and Maritime and Port Authority of Singapore. A total of 161 papers offers were received. 102 papers were selected for presentation at the Conference. The two Keynote Lecturers for the Conference were Dr M. Rahmatullah of the United Nations ESCAP and Professor K. C. Sinha of Purdue University. Dr John Chen, the Minister of State, Ministry of Communications was the Guest of Honour. A total of 203 delegates from 26 countries participated in the 3-day event.
- (2) The 1999 Symposium on Public Transit for the 21st Century was held on 15-16 May 1999 at the Singapore Expo Centre in conjunction with the EXPO RAIL Asia '99. Ten technical papers were presented at the symposium on the first day. The second day featured a technical visit to SMRT Maintenance Depot at Bishan. The Symposium was attended by 78 participants.
- (3) 6th Int. Conf on Applications of Advanced Technologies in Transportation Engineering. This was the 6th conference of an ASCE (American Society of Civil Engineers) conference, held in Asia for the first time. It was held on 28-30 June 2000 at Westin Stamford, Singapore. A total of 203 participants from 22 countries participated in the conference. Nearly 100 papers were presented at the 3-day conference. Four workshops on special topics of interest were conducted. Technical visits to CityCab GPS Taxi Despatching Centre and the ERP Control Centre were arranged.
- (4) The 2001 Symposium on Airport Infrastructure Development and Management was held on 25-26 April 2001 at Singapore Expo in conjunction with an exhibition on advanced airport technologies. 14 technical papers were presented at the symposium on the first day. The afternoon of the second day featured a technical visit

to the new MRT station at Singapore Changi Airport. The Symposium was attended by 69 participants.

- (5) STSS hosted the 2002 IEEE 5th International Conference on Intelligent Transportation Systems held in Suntec City from 3 to 6 September 2002. This conference series is sponsored by the IEEE ITS Council. The focus of the conference is on basic research and applications of latest advances in communications, computer, control, electronics and related technologies in ITS. The past 4 conferences were held in Boston USA (1997), Tokyo Japan (1999), Dearborn USA (2000), and Oakland USA (2001). The conference consisted of 3 full-day of technical sessions plus technical visits on Day 4. It was attended by 145 participants from 21 countries.
- (6) 2004 Symposium on GIS/GPS Applications in Transportation Advanced Technologies in Transportation Engineering, 19-20 March 2004, Singapore. The symposium featured 8 papers, a forum and a technical visit. It was attended by more than 70 participants.
