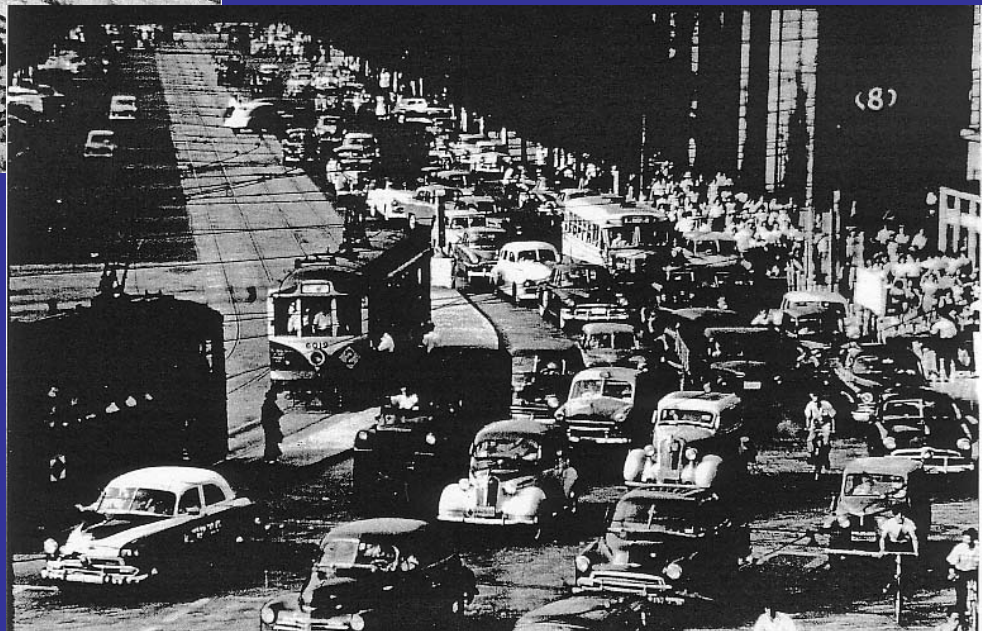

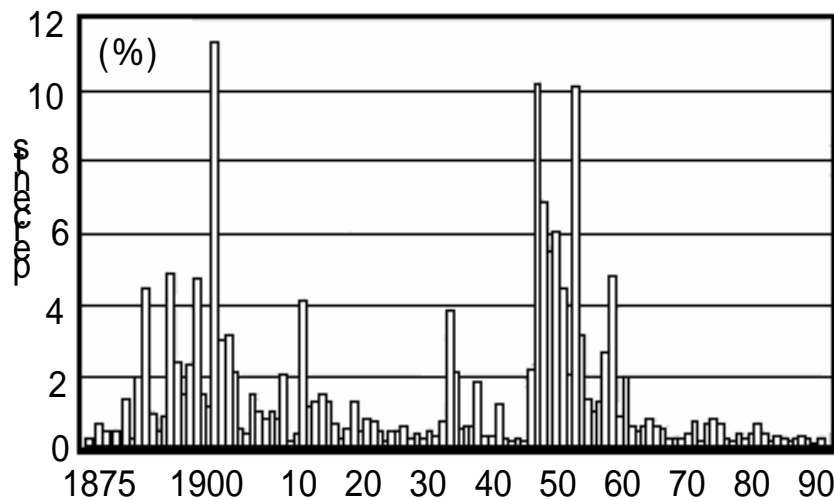

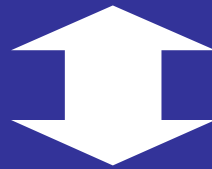

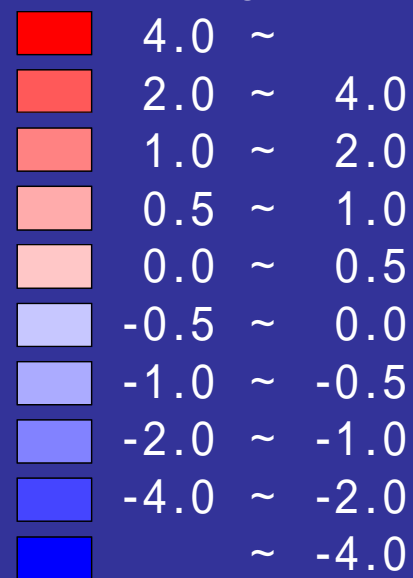

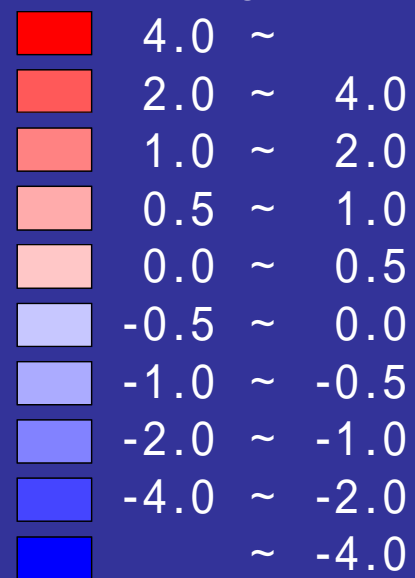

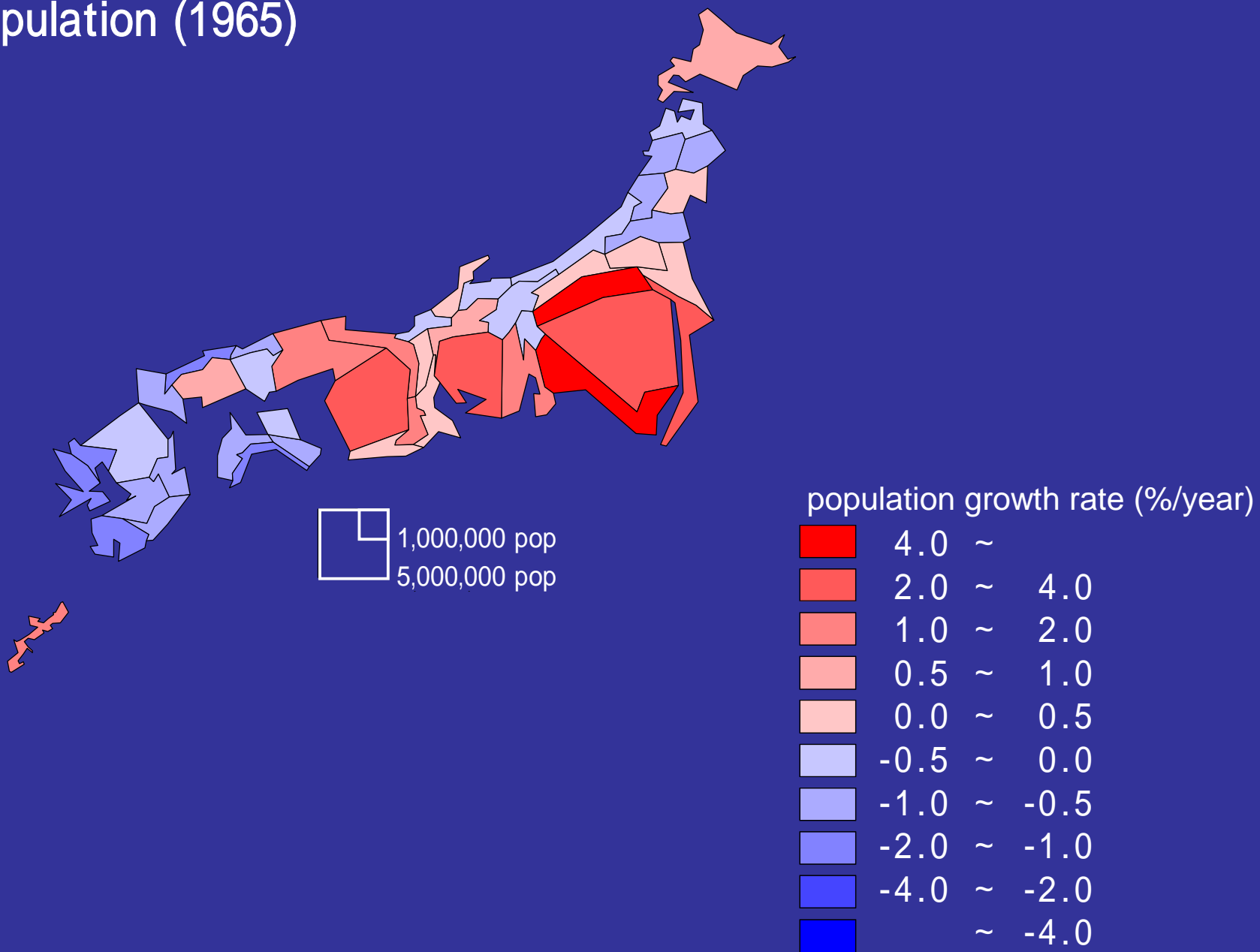

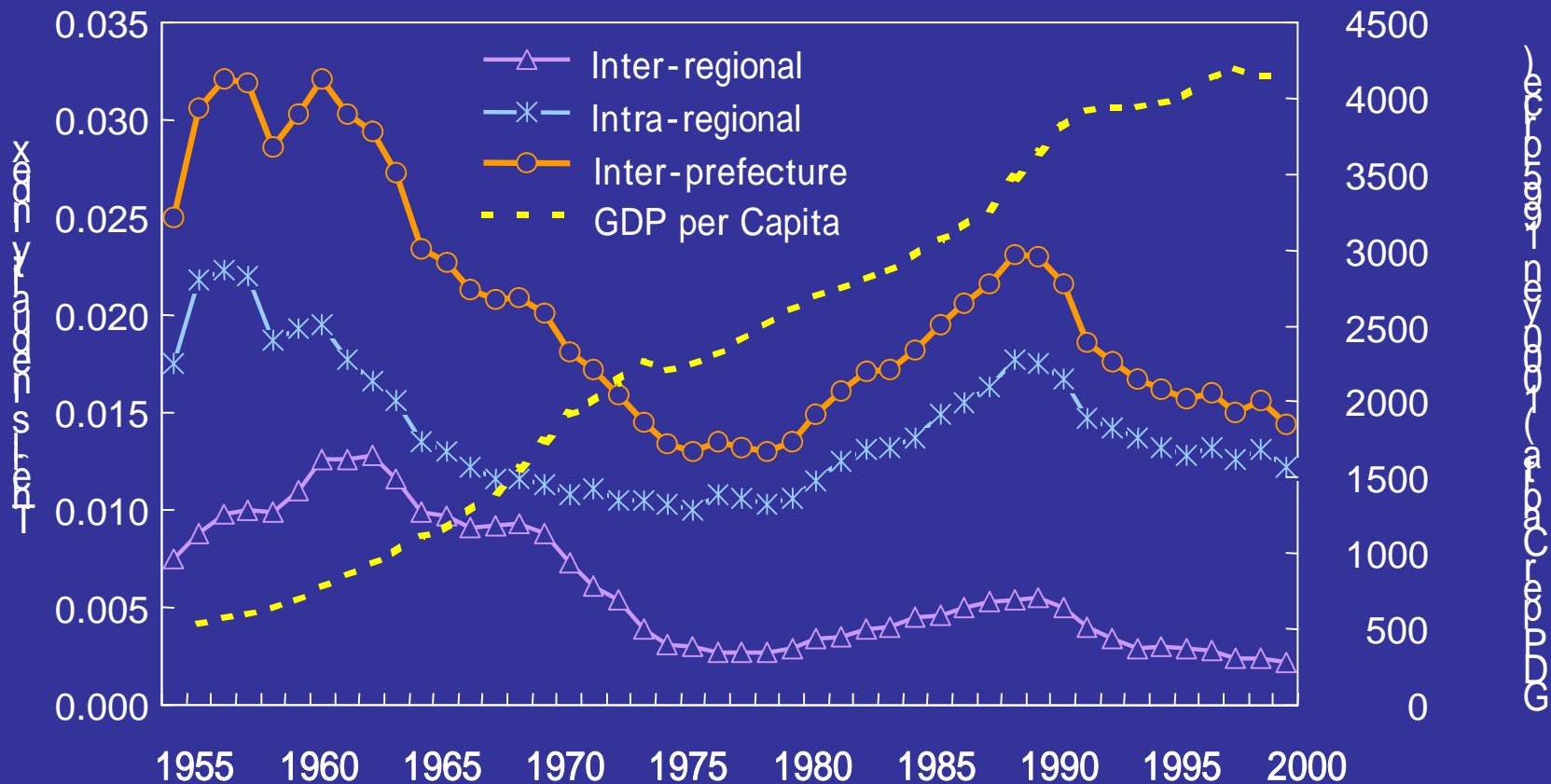

## Regional Income Disparity and Net Migration to Three Metropolitan Areas



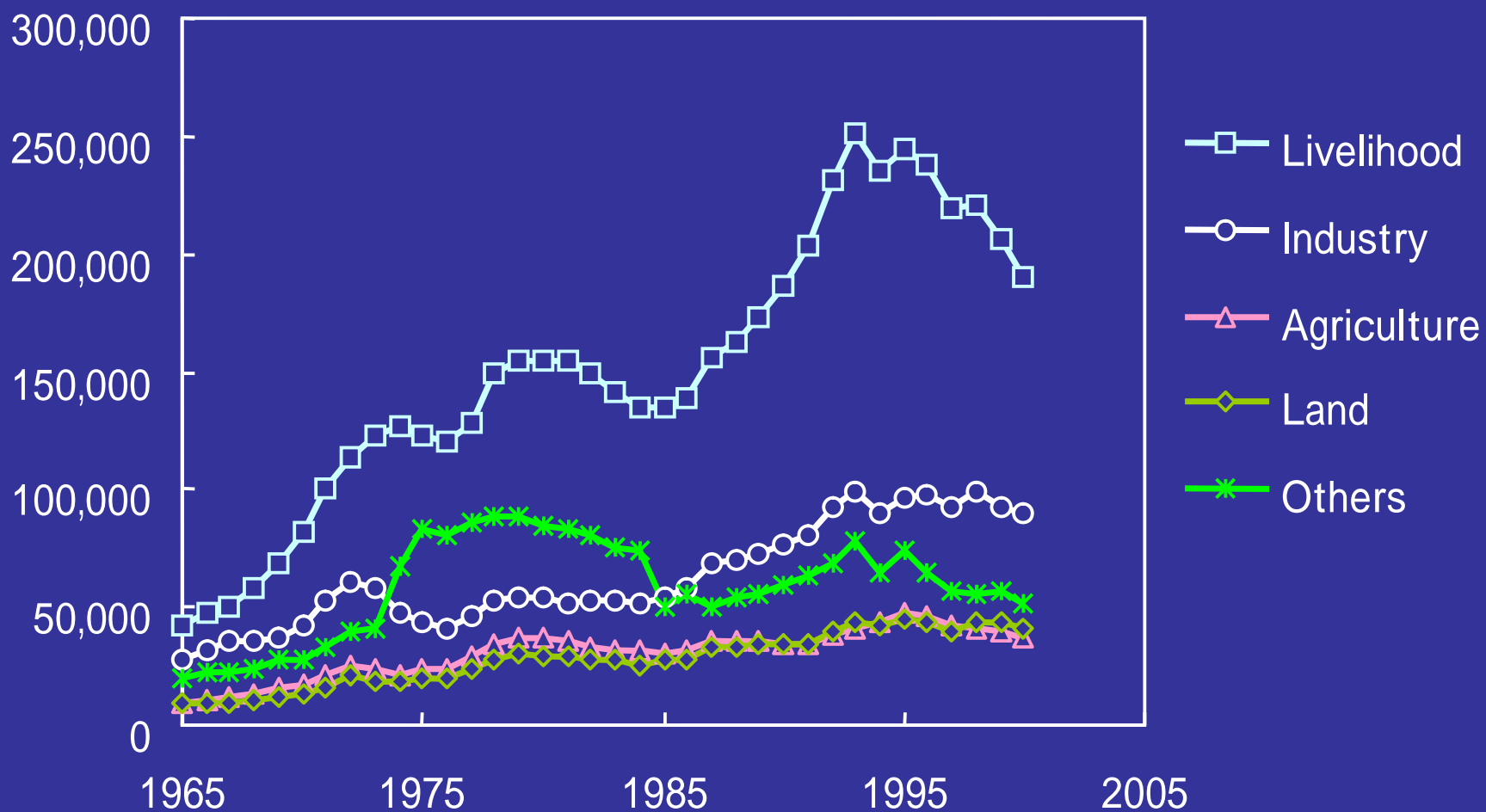

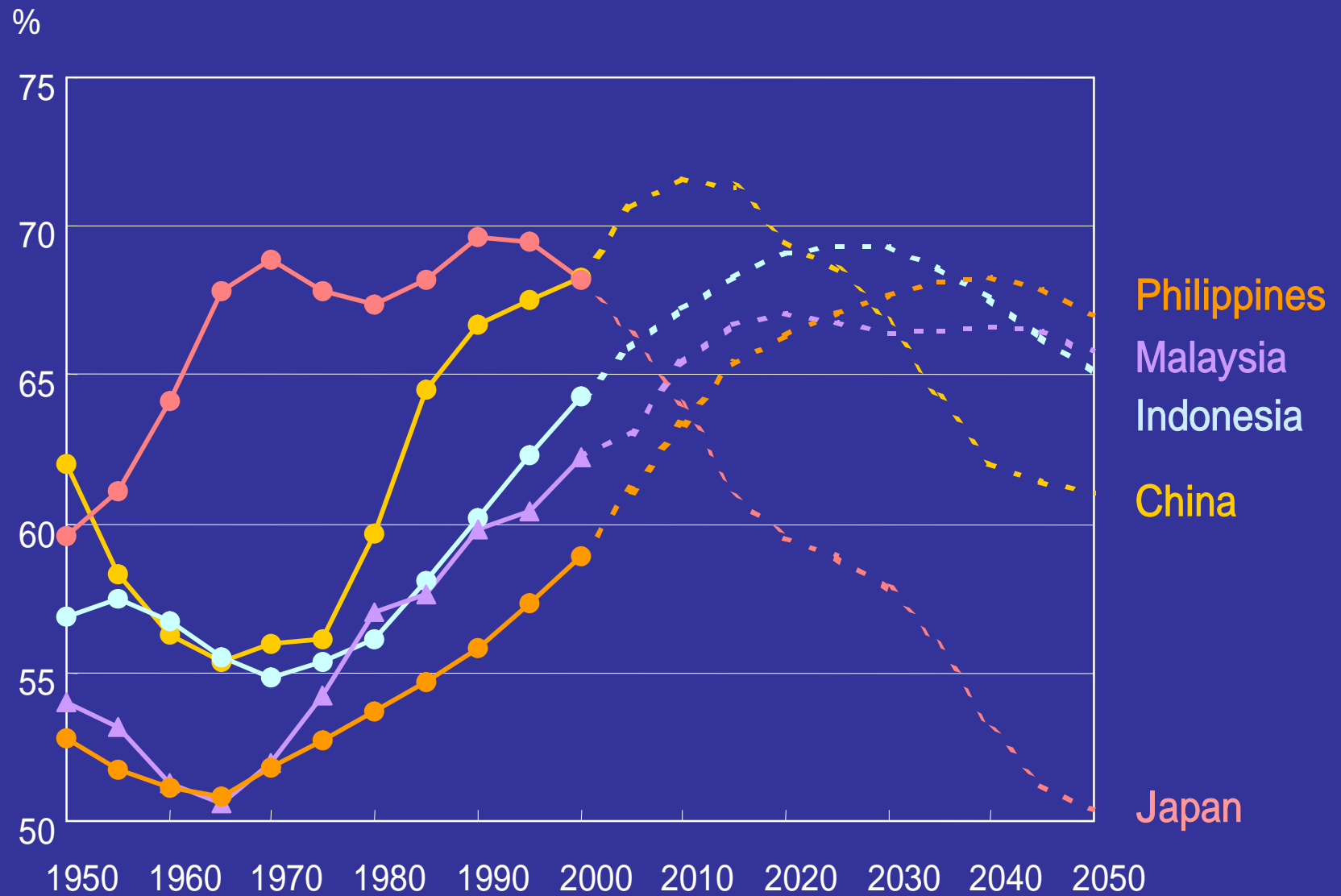

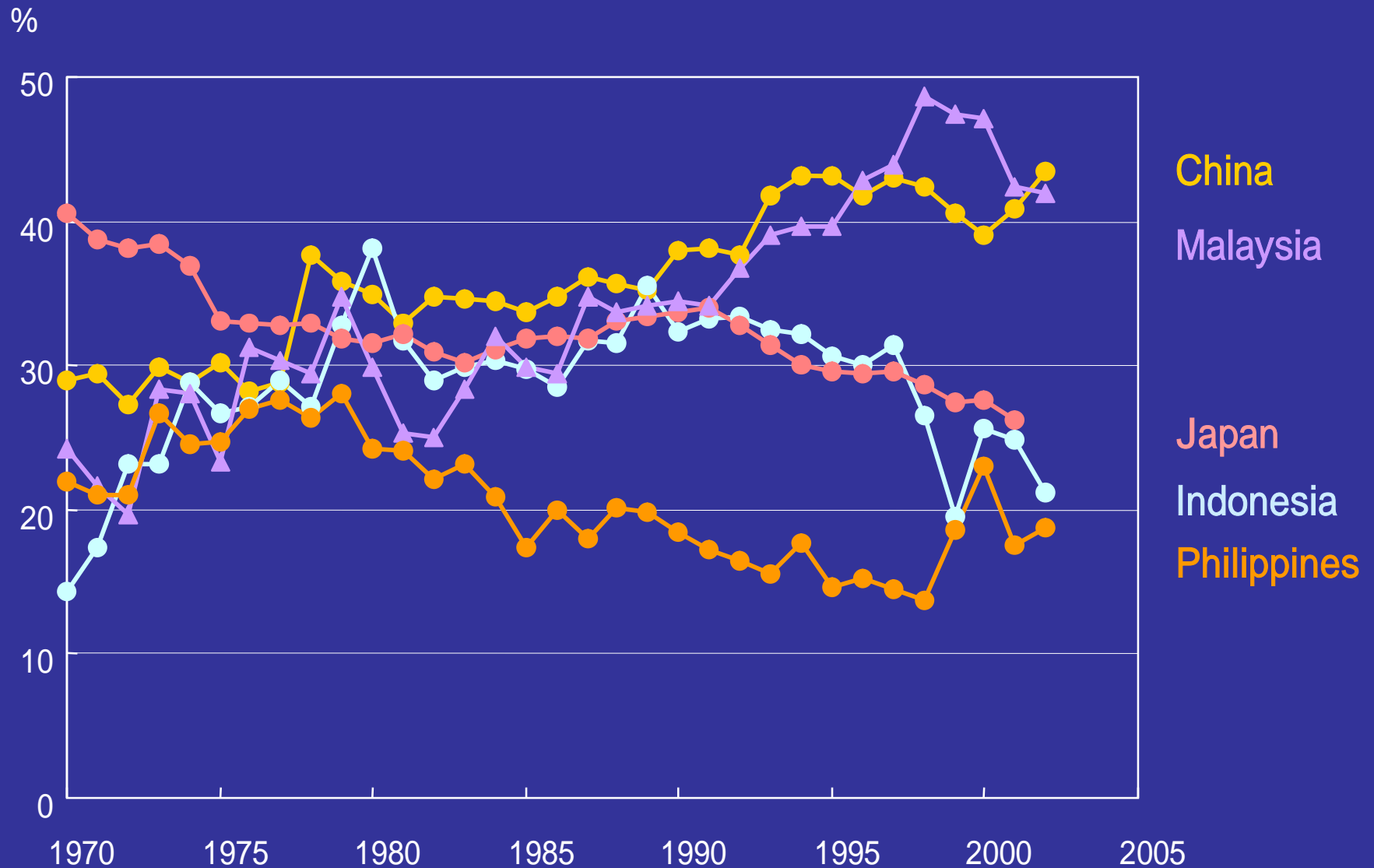


# Working Age Population Ratio in Eastern Asia Countries

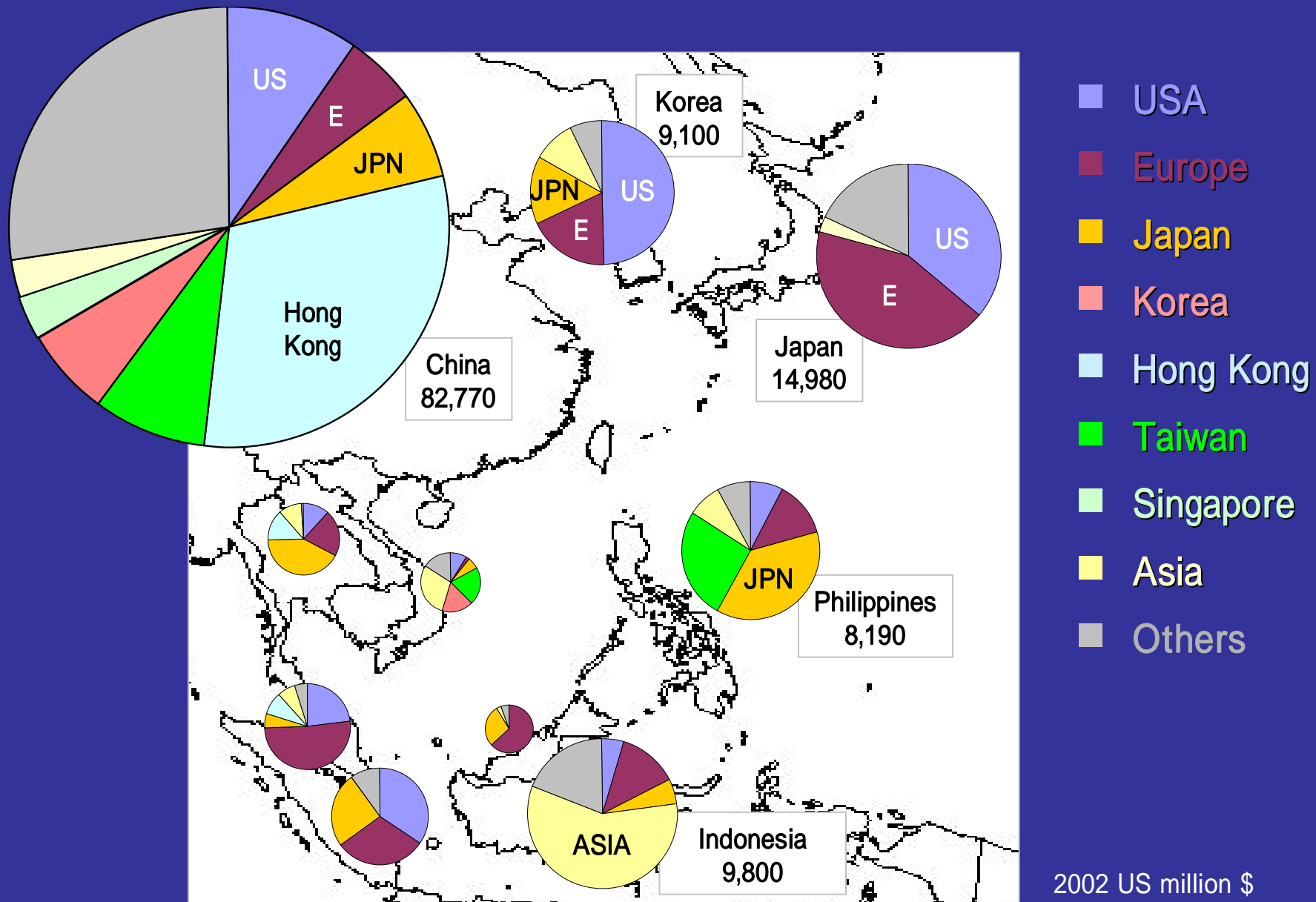

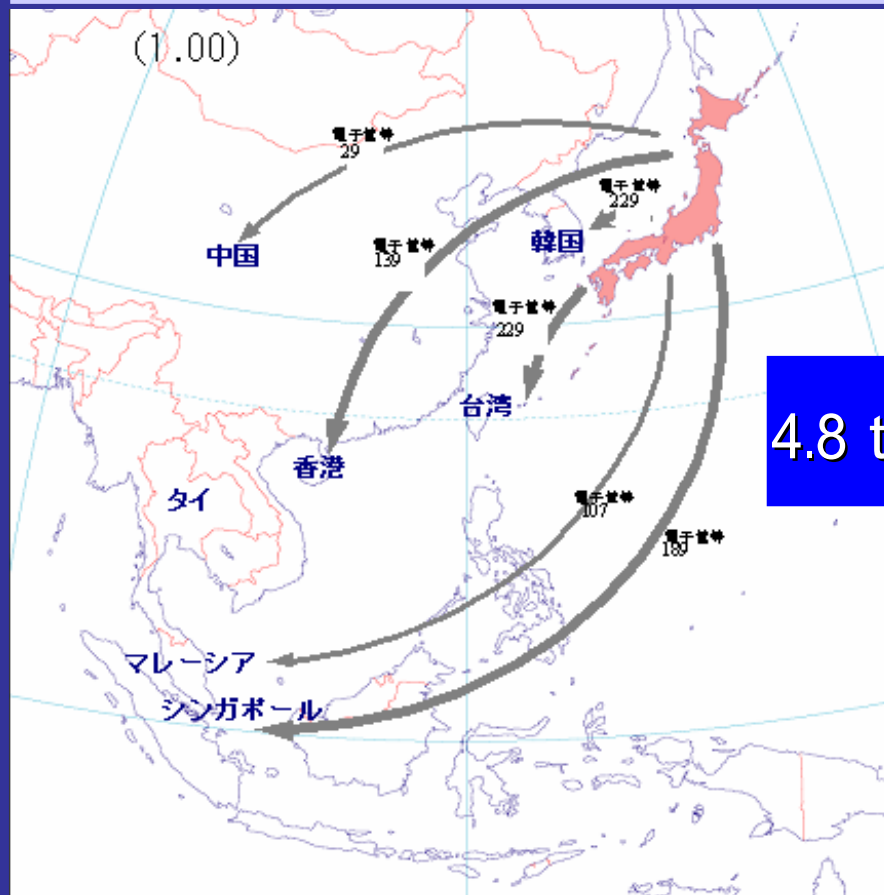

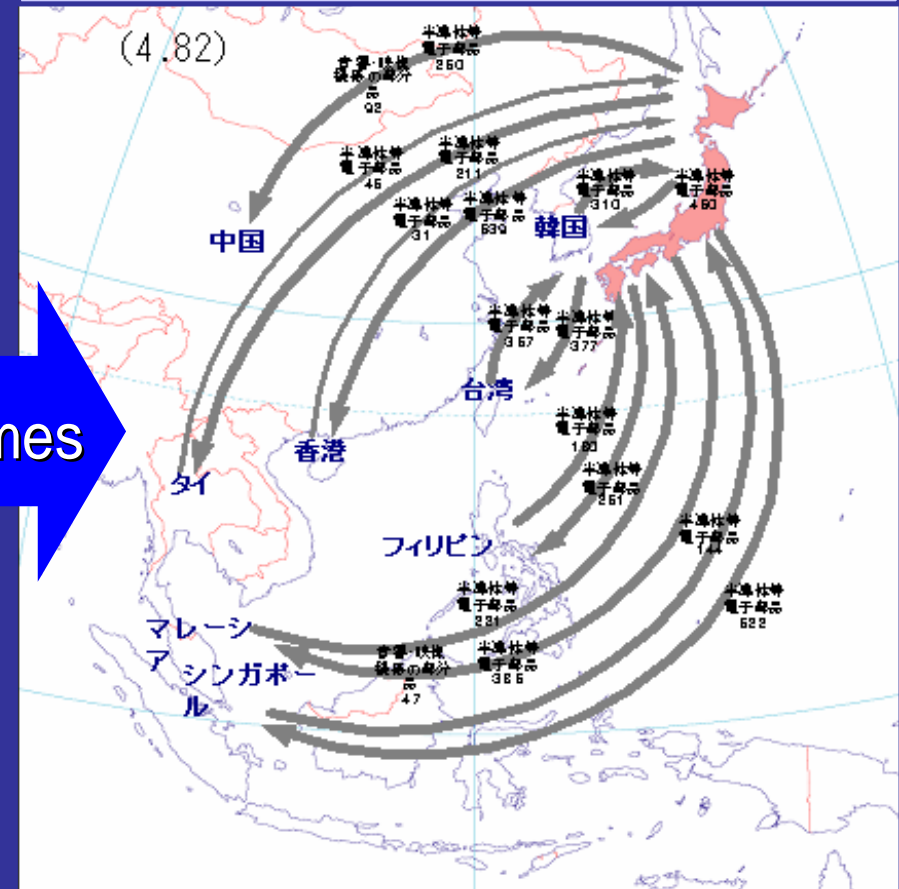


# Trade-flows in Electronic Components between Japan and Eastern Asia

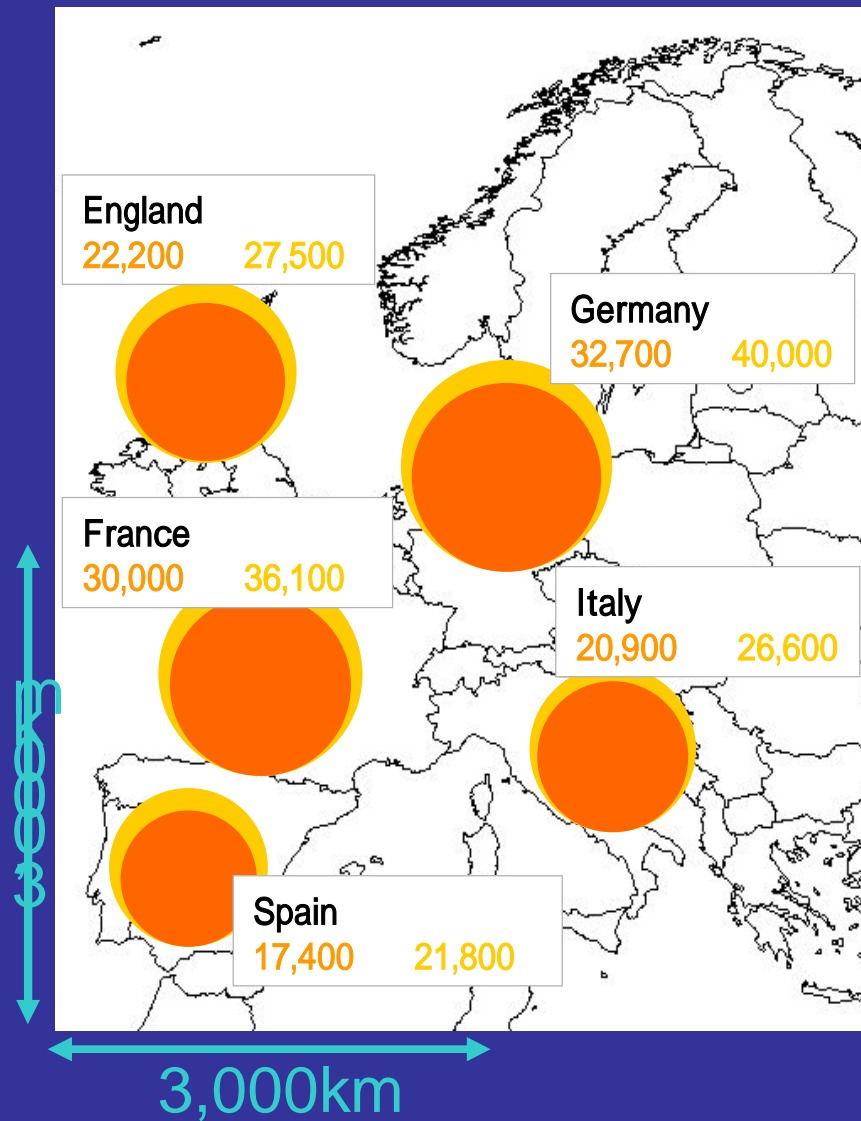

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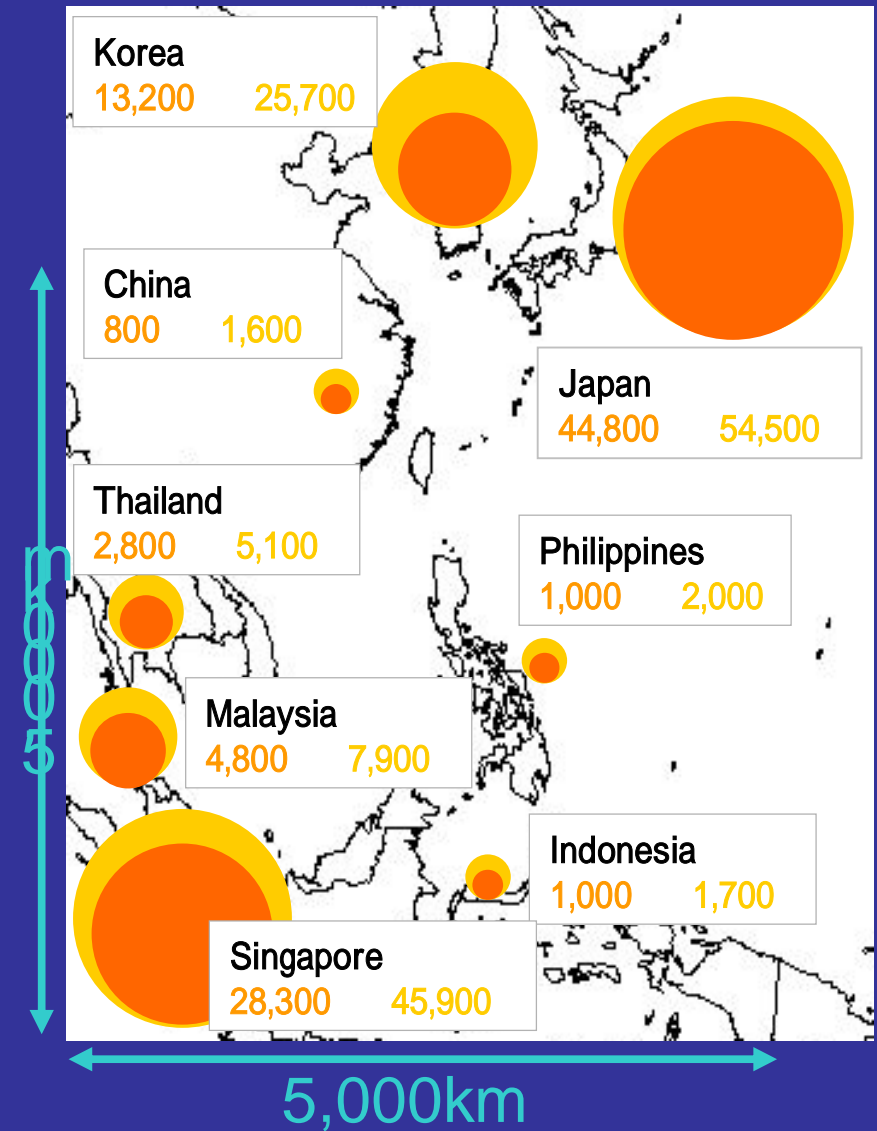

## GDP per Capita of EU Countries ( 2000 , 2010 1995 US \$ )



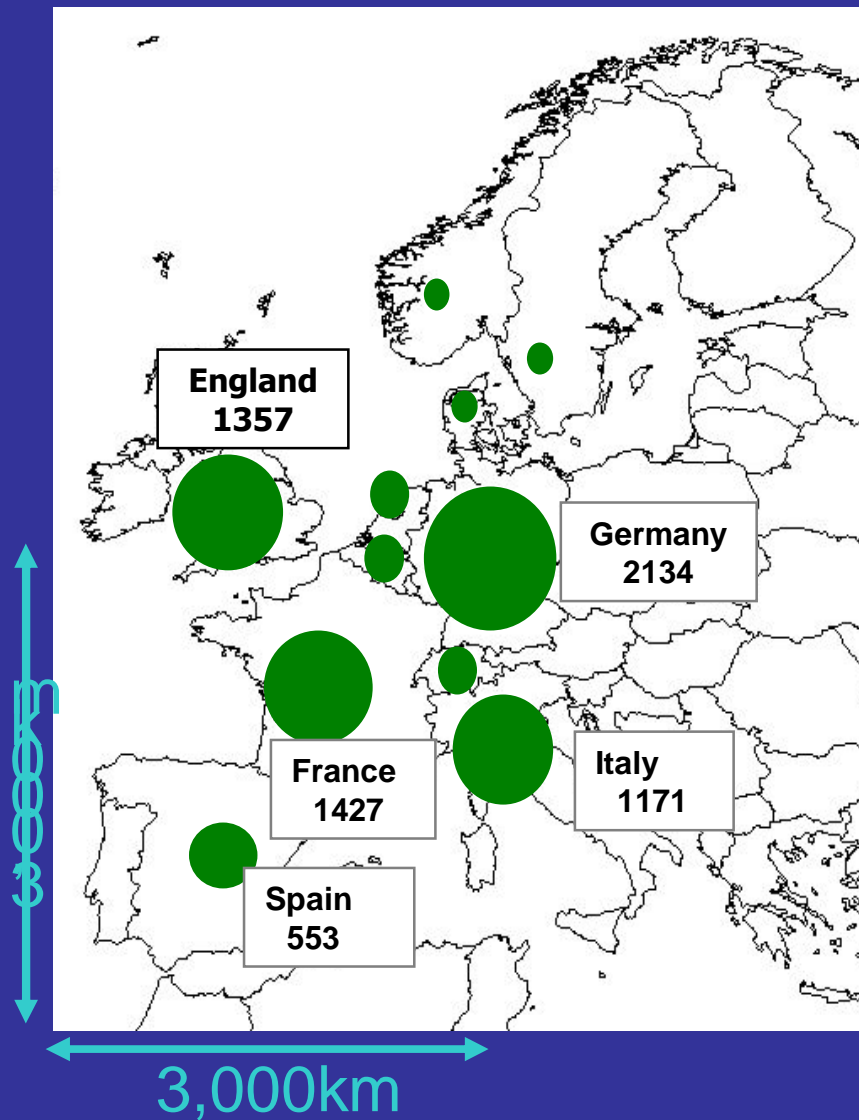
## GDP per Capita of Eastern Asia Countries ( 2000 , 2010 1995 US \$ )

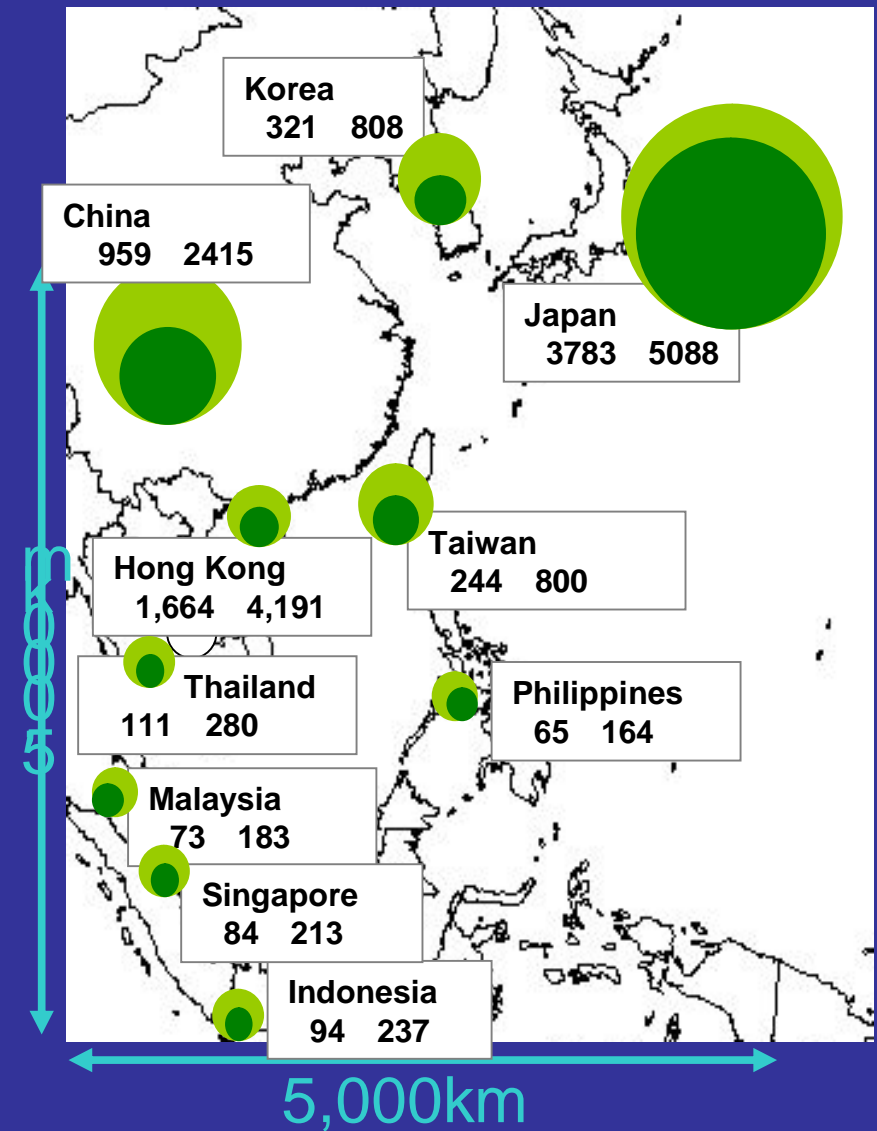
## GDP of EU Countries

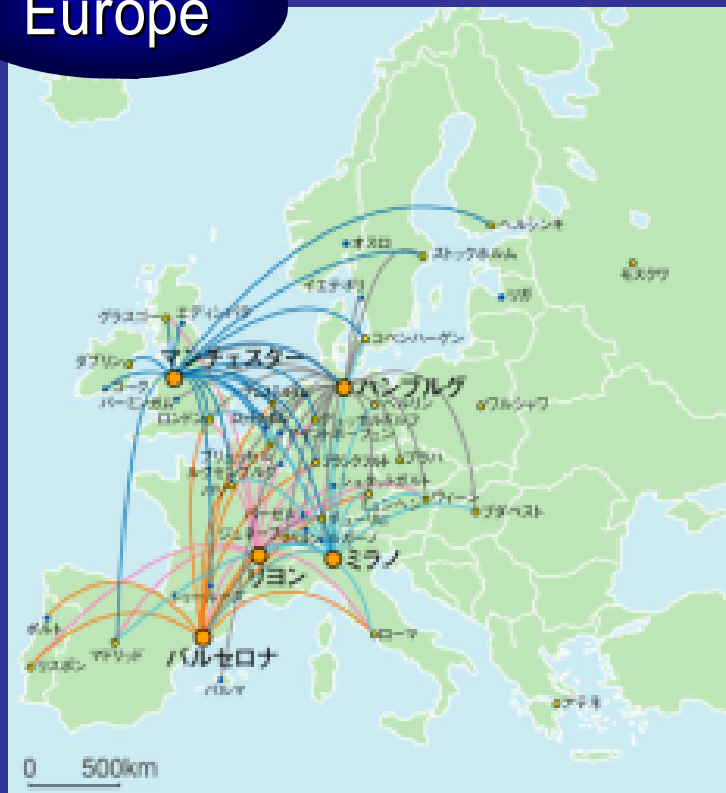

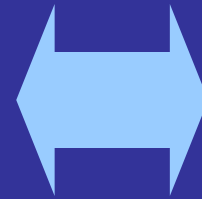

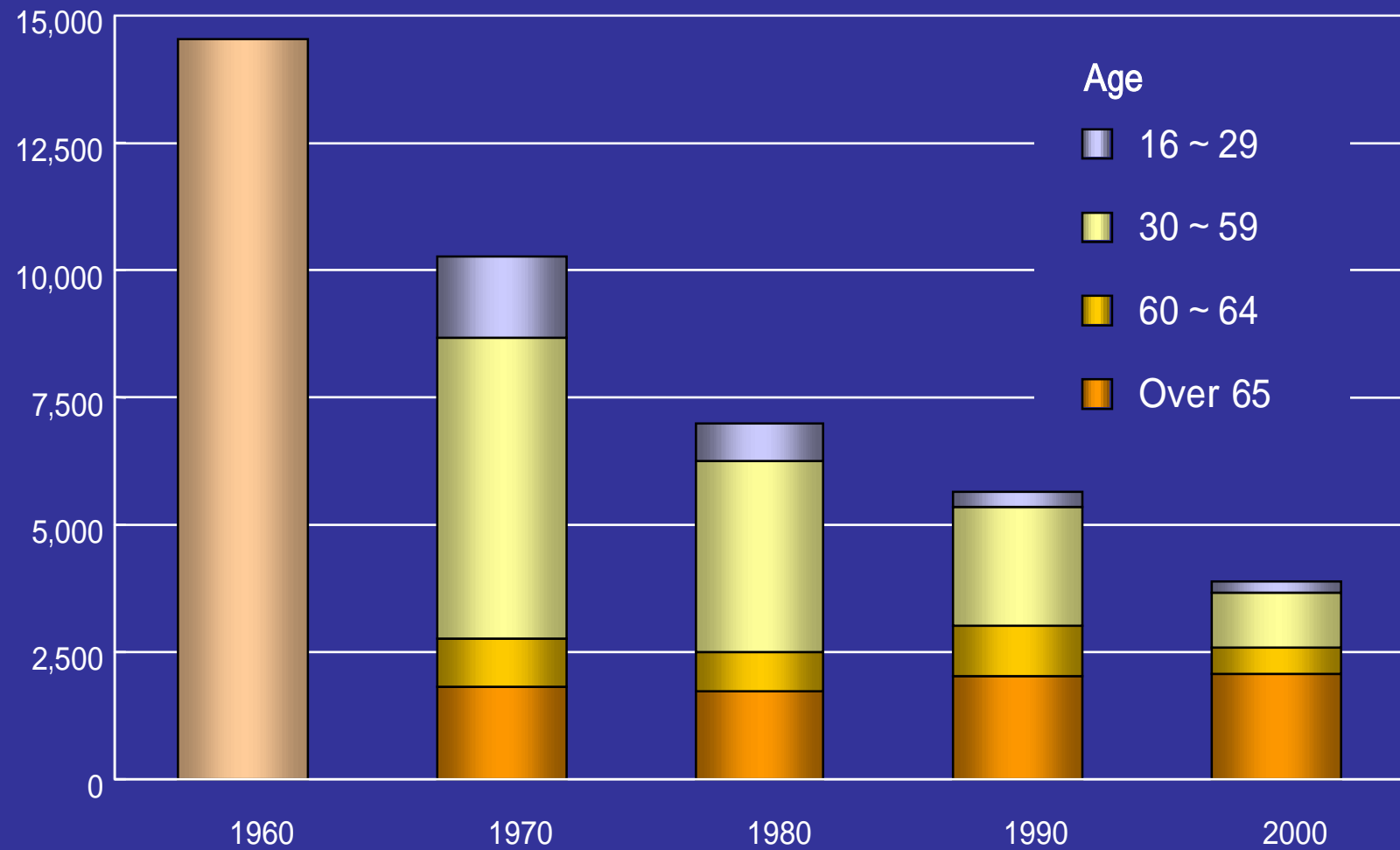

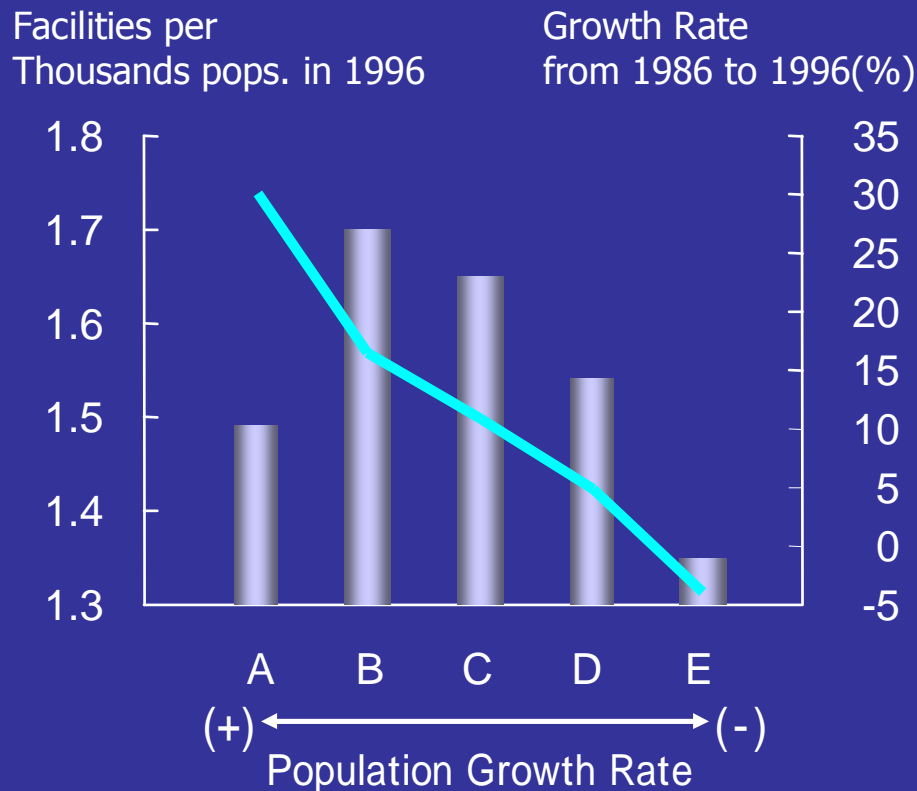

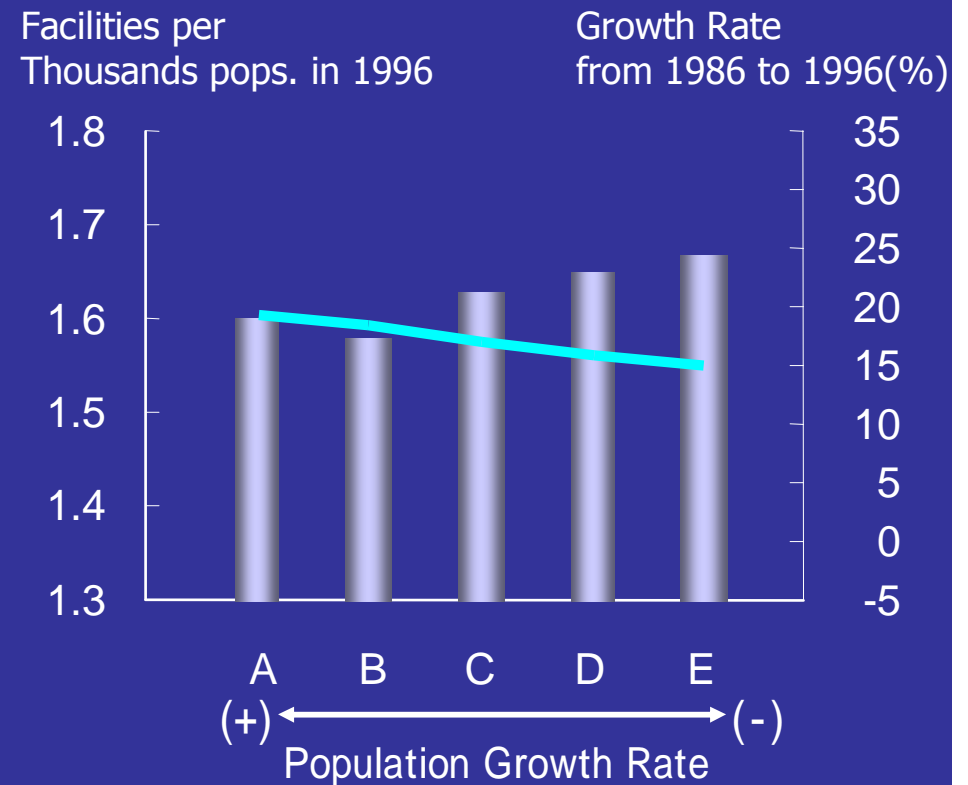


# Growth rate and distribution of Medical Facilities in Local Area

## Livelihood Activity Local Area (one-hour-trip area)



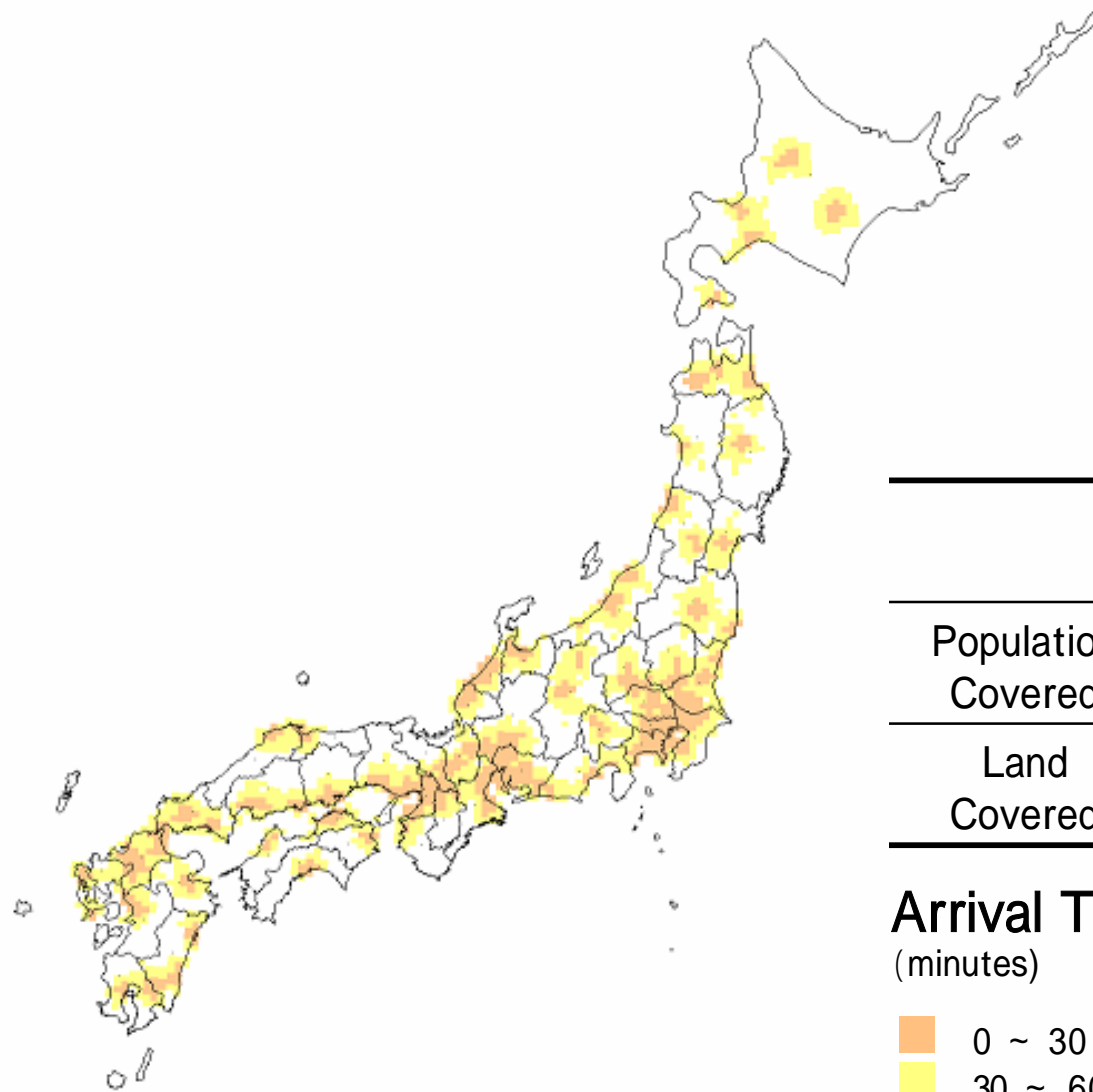

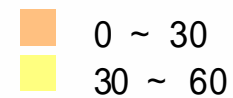

# Accessibility Coverage Shopping Center over 30 Thousand Square Meter Gross Floor Area within an Hour



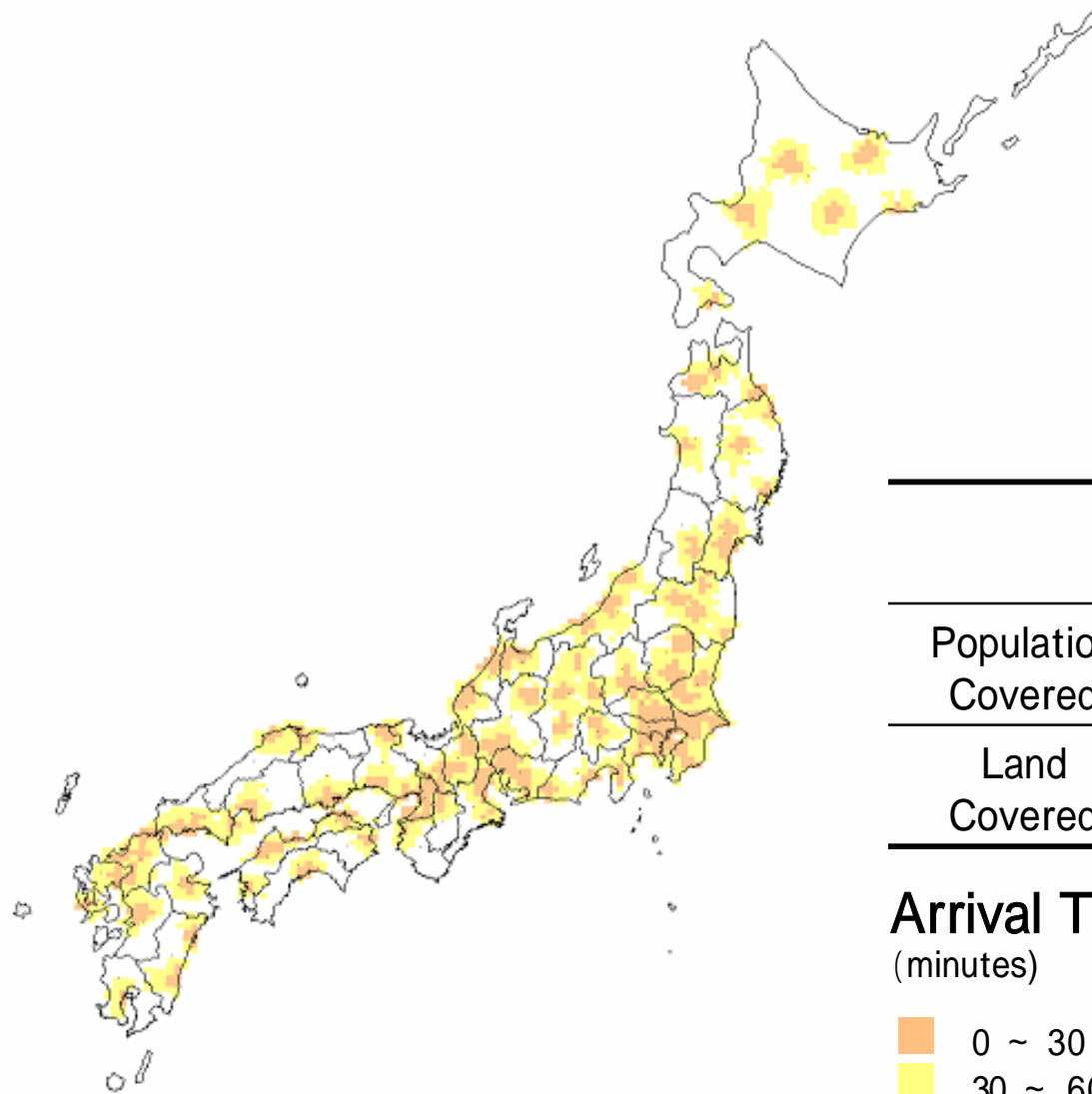

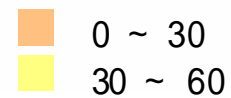

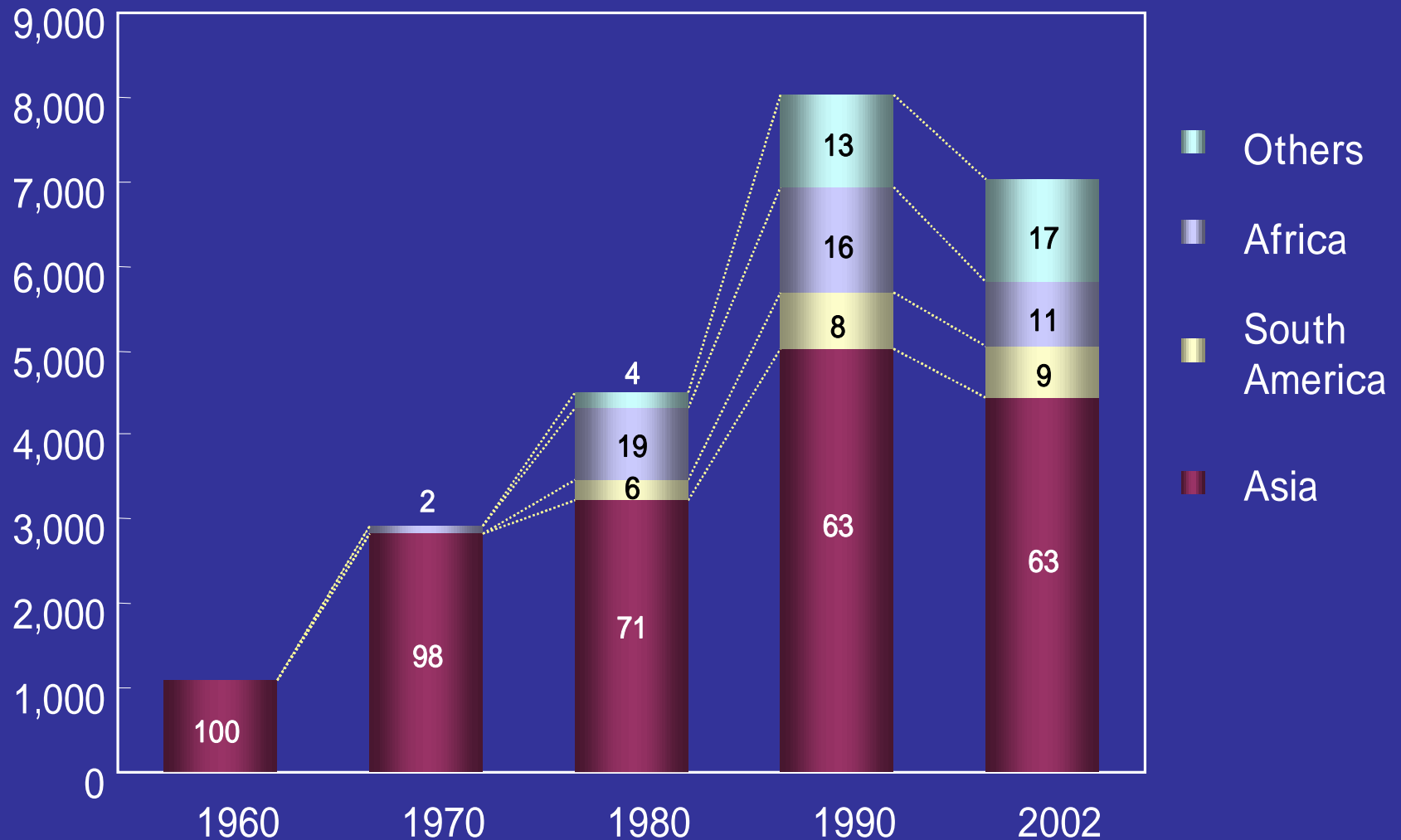
