It has over the last 20 years been of interest to niche groups like Asian postgraduate students, NZ professionals with a focus on international affairs and Asian immigrants who like

keeping a strong affinity with professional development in their home countries.

Therefore, EASTS is not in competition with organisations like CILT, CBAFF, NZPI (NZ Planning Institute) and IPENZ (Transport) and needs to be recognised as complimentary.

Clearly speaking the thrust of EASTS NZ is to create opportunities to

- 1) Young graduates and academics based in South East Asian countries to come to NZ for further graduate studies or just to explore professional opportunities in NZ or perhaps in a first instance to embark on an internship;
- 2) NZ employers in the transport & urban planning, enabling them to recruit first hand young professionals from a variety of Asian countries & universities known to 'produce' first class professionals, usually very specialised in ITC and modelling and
- 3) NZ employers in the logistics & trade sector operating internationally, helping them to source staff understanding Asian cultures, languages and thus, enhancing success of trade or business between NZ and Asian countries;
- 4) NZ consultancies interested in building up networks with Asian EASTS societies to get involved in international projects as many infrastructure projects are associated with World Bank or Asian Development Bank (ADB).

What next for the next 12-18 months?

- Increase of EASTS NZ activities with the support of academics and industry through joint seminars CILT-IPENZ- CBAFF & ASEAN to outline tangible value of networking between EASTS NZ members and industry sponsors
- Enhancing opportunities for an international internship exchange programme on a trial basis
- Build up a network of sponsors that will enable fund setting up and organising professional presentation sessions on relevant matters in transport & logistics associated to specific Asian-NZ

 - 1) Conference
 - 1.1 The 23rd TSSP Annual Conference last August 8, 2016 was well attended with more than 140 participants from academe, government and private sector. Universities represented include University of the Philippines Diliman, University of the Philippines Los Banos, De La Salle University, Mapua Institute of Technology, Polytechnic University of the Philippines, University of Northern Philippines, Surigao Del Sur State University, De La Salle University-Dasmarinas, and Southern Luzon State University.

1.2 The Transportation Science Society of the Philippines held its 24th annual national conference last July 21, 2017 at the National Center for



Transportation Studies, UP Diliman, With the theme: Quezon City. Improving Quality of Life in Urban and Rural Areas through Inclusive Transportation, the conference was attended by more than 150 participants coming not only from Metro Manila, but even as far as Baguio city up North and Cagayan de

Oro City down South. Prof. Dr. Tetsuo YAI, President of EASTS graced the conference by giving a keynote lecture entitled *Emerging Asia Strategy for Transport-oriented Sustainability*. From students to professionals, from academe to government representatives, and even those from the private sector, everyone aspires to help improve the transportation problems of the nation and one simple step towards this goal is by attending this conference. The conference discussed many issues in the transport sector and presented goals to achieve in the coming years.

- 2) Seminar, Symposium, Workshop, Forum or Lecture
- 2.1 Saint Louis University held a Research Forum on Transportation Planning last March 19, 2017(Sunday) at the Otto Hahn Building, Saint Louis University (SLU), Baguio City. The forum was attended by a total of 72 participants with students and faculty coming from various universities in Baguio and Pangasinan such as University of the Cordilleras, Pangasinan State University, and Saint Louis University. Officials of the local government units (LGU) of Baguio city also graced the forum with their presence. President of the Transportation Science Society of the Philippines and DLSU civil engineering faculty, Dr. Alexis Fillone, presented a transportation planning tool,

DYNAMEQ, and its application to Baguio City. Dr. Fillone is the thesis adviser of both Engr. Ranosa and Engr. Baldo. The forum yielded fruitful discussions and the LGUs were happy with the ongoing transport research studies being



conducted in their city. The exposure of transportation studies gave students a better understanding of the transportation planning field and made them interested in the field of transportation planning and engineering. The forum was sponsored by the School of Engineering and Architecture of UPang, the Center for Engineering and Sustainable Development Research (CESDR) of DLSU and the Transportation Science Society of the Philippines (TSSP).

2.2 The first ever Research Forum on Transportation Planning was held in the PHINMA University of Pangasinan (UPang) last March 17, 2017. It



was attended by third and fourth year civil engineering students of the University taking up Surveying and Highway Engineering, respectively. Students and staff of De La Salle University from the transportation engineering division presented their ongoing transportation studies

for Dagupan City. The focus of the forum was to provide insights and ideas to students who wants to pursue transportation planning and engineering as their chosen field of specialization in civil engineering. The forum was a success as many students are now interested in the

transportation field. The opening of two fields of specialization major in structural engineering and transportation engineering will start in UPang next year (2018). The forum was sponsored by the School of Engineering and Architecture of UPang, the Center for Engineering and Sustainable Development Research (CESDR) of DLSU and the Transportation Science Society of the Philippines (TSSP).

2.3 Last February 17, 2017, De La Salle University - Manila hosted the Intelligent Transport Systems (ITS) Forum 2017 at the 5th floor Henry Sy Sr. Hall. Sponsored by the Philippine Council for Industry, Energy and Emerging Technology Research and Development of the

Department of Science and Technology (PCIEERD-DOST), DLSU-Manila, UP-National Center for Transportation Studies (NCTS), and Transportation Society of Science the Philippines (TSSP), the forum was attended by representatives of different agencies in public (DOST,



DPWH, MMDA, DOTr), local(MTRO, MTPB), private bus companies, and institutional (UP, DLSU, MIT) sectors. In the afternoon, workshops were held discussing the DOST roadmap and the ITS masterplan. Representatives from DOST, DPWH, MMDA, DOTr, the academe, and privates industries were part of the discussion. The workshop was a success with many fresh ideas and outputs developed. A total of 73 people participated in the forum including faculty, staff and students from DLSU.

- 3.1 The first and 2nd quarter newsletters of the TSSP showcased the activities from January to March 2017 and April to June 2017. The newsletter discussed four events: the ITS Forum, the yearend fellowship last 2016, and the two-research forum held at Dagupan city and Baguio City. 


3.2 Journal revival of the TSSP

Dr. Primitivo Cal (Lifetime member) is the Executive Director of the UP Planning and Development Research Foundation, Inc. He discussed Metro Manila's worsening traffic congestion and provide some solutions how to address them in TV 5 Akyson.



Dr. Ricardo Sigua (Lifetime member) is currently the Director of the Institute of Civil Engineering, University of the Philippines. He shared his insights on how to address the current worsening traffic conditions of Metro Manila's roads as well as the increasing number of traffic accidents.



Dr. Alexis Fillone (Lifetime member) is the president of TSSP. He discussed the PUBFix project which utilizes technology to improve bus service operation along EDSA.



Dr. Elmer Dadios (Regular member) is the project leader of CATCH-All. He discussed about the contactless apprehension of traffic violators on a 24-hr basis which is currently being pilot-tested along roads in the vicinity of De La Salle University.



Engr. Alben Bagabaldo (Regular member) discussed also in CNN's The Service Road the use of satellite images in transport planning which was aired last May 31, 2017.



4.3 TSSP issued a statement regarding Uber and Grab taxi service

The TSSP issued a statement regarding the service operation of Uber and Grab Taxis in Metro Manila as provided below:

TRANSPORTATION SCIENCE SOCIETY OF THE PHILIPPINES



Introduction

The Transportation Science Society of the Philippines is a professional association dedicated to the progress of transportation through science and research. As such, we expressed our concerns on the apparent crackdowns on transport network vehicle services — such as Uber and Grab. Innovations that provide more and better options for our suffering commuters deserve to be encouraged, rather than ourtailed.

It is acknowledged that the entry of this ICT-based transport services has challenged orthodoxy. From the lens of history, however, these controversies are but the natural noises and ripples that usually accompany the introduction of game-changing disruptive technologies.

New Technologies are Disruptive

We are at the beginning of the 4" Industrial Revolution, as Professor Klaus Schwab – the founder of World Economic Forum – has argued in his 2016 seminal book of the same title. The 4" IR is disruptive, as the advent of the 3" IR was to the 2", and the 2" to the 1". New technologies are disruptive of the old order. Uber, Grab and their technological siblings are merely the first wave of the upheavels yet to come in the field of transportation.

When railroads entered the business of moving people and goods, there were disserts from the business of horse-drawn carriages. Coachmen, blacksmitts and stable workers feared for their jobs.

There was a time when jeepney drivers and operators got agitated by the opening of the first LRT in ASEAN capitals on Rizal and Taft Avenue. They threstened a jeepney strike.

Not so long ago, FX service entered service in many Philippine cities - without the regulatory blessings of LTFRB. They posed an existential breat to jeepneys and taxis. The shared taxi model with a distinctly Filipino appellation was subsequently legitimized, into what is now known as GT Express or UV Express.

The 4" Industrial Revolution is "unlike anything that humankind has experienced before" – in terms of valocity, acope, and systems impact, it is blurring traditional industry boundaries. To site a few. "Uber, the world's largest laxi company, owns no vehicles. Facebook, the world's most popular media owner, creases no content. Alibaba, the most valuable retailer, has no inventory. And Airbab, the world's largest hotel chain, owns no hotel."

Philippines Transport

Where is Philippines transport in the overall scheme of technological developments? Sadly, still stuck between the 2rd and 3rd iR. The obliquitous vehicles in oties and in the countryside are the jeepneys and the tricycles. The jeepney is a technology more than 60 years old that emerged out of the ashes of WW2. The tricycle is the modification of motorcycles. Both contraptions met a need for mobility and flourished without government regulation as to vehicle standards and specifications.

In Metro Manila, about 40% of daily trips are borne by jeepneys. The jeepney sector feets threatened by the government's PUV Modernization Program, a belated public-financed program to bring jeepneys into the modern era – from the 2" to the 3" IR. On the other

hand, privately-funded, modernizing intruders of the 4" IR kind - like Uber and Grab - are viewed with suspicion by the same people pushing for PUV modernization.

The widespread market acceptance of Uber is phenomenal, and yet it is only 8 years old. It was conceived as a replacement to car ownership. One can have the benefits of car travel, without owning the car. They would not have blossomed if the ground was not fertile, if our buses and mass transit systems were operating at higher standards. Reliable and high level of service are apprecions never realized by our antiquated regulations.

And yet, the Ubers of today would look primitive when the full-scale impact of the 4th IR reaches inflection point. Self-driving care is no longer a question of IF, but WHEN. Singapore will be testing this August self-driving taxis. Elon Musk is investing on a '5" mode of transport, what he has christened as the Hyperloop. Dubai is lesting autonomous serial vehicles, more popularly known as Drone Taxes. Amazon is trying out drones to deliver goods to the doorseps.

The internet of Things will usher in the Age of intelligent Transport Systems – wherein all vehicles, private or public – will be inter-connected with each other and with the physical infrastructure. The question is; shall we oppose these new waves of services, in the name of laws made for another era?

The lasue of Regulation

We concede that government has the responsibility to step in - when there is clear and present danger. The TNVS - such as Uper, Grab, Easy Taxi, Wunder carpool, and smiler ride sharing services do not. There are research data to back the up, aside from anecdotal evidence. Recently, two scientific papers from the University of the Philippines came out about TNVs vis-a-vis the conventional taxis. The findings overwhelmingly found TNVs as bottler than regular taxis - in terms of safety, security and quality of service.


The common-sense recommendation is to upgrade those in the bottom rung to the highest common denominator, rather than the converse. It is wonto that the buses, jeepneys, and taxis proudly touting their LTFRS enointments are caught on a low-performance equilibrium trap.

There is plenty for the government to learn from TNVs — especially since they are misunderstood by a bureaucracy inured to the old way of doing things. To put order in our chaotic public transport, it needs technology — the kind demonstrated by Liber and Grab. The quickest way to deliver us from traffic hell is by promoting ride-sharing and car-pooling. The favorite solution, milways, have long gestation periods, their benefits could only be felt five years down the road. The multiliside of juepneys and busins can be likened to bee colonies without a queen bee for each colony. And yet, the elusive holy grall of public transport regulation can be found in the TNVs, the early birds of a future intelligent Transport Systems.

Technological innovations and the market are, more often than not, several steps arread of our legal framework. The Public Service Act that was crafted in 1936 never anticipated TNVs, nor imagined the feudal "boundary" system. Literal interpretation would put some components of the TNV accessater in the ambit of this obsolete law, but its contral nervious system, the digital platform, is outside of it. The closest fit that could characterized the latter can be found in the Telecommunications Act of 1995, rather than in the archaic Public Service Act.

Given the ambiguity, the previous administration, in a rare display of foresight and sense of public good, issued Department Order No. 2015-011 that gave recognition to Transport Network Vehicle Services (TNVS) – notwithstanding the fact that they do not fit the public utility mold. Some could argue that it was "ultra vives". Or an act of daring foresight.

4.4 TSSP, through its members, is helping the Department of Transportation (DOTr) to come up with a Local Public Transport Route Plan Manual to be used in the issuance of new public transport franchises in the country. This manual will come out soon.



4.5 TSSP is one of the local partners helping DOTr in its Public Utility Vehicle (PUV) modernization program. The program aims to (a) modernize the current PUV fleet, (b) reform and consolidate the public transport service industry, (c) move towards cleaner vehicles using low emission PUVs, (d) improve the welfare of commuters and encourage mode shifting, and (e) improve the standard of living of drivers, operators, and their families.
