1) Conference

- International Conference on Sustainable Cities (ICoSC) in conjunction with 15th Malaysian Universities Transport Research Forum Conference (MUTRFC)

The International Conference on Sustainable Cities (ICoSC) in conjunction with 15th Malaysian Universities Transport Research Forum Conference (15th MUTRFC) was successfully conducted on 27th July 2021. The ICoSC & MUTRFC conference was co-organised by Politeknik Ungku Omar (PUO), Universiti

Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) and Transportation Science Society of Malaysia (TSSM). The initial plan was to conduct a two-day conventional physical conference; however, it was cancelled until the last minute due to COVID-19 pandemic and subsequently, the conference was conducted fully online via Zoom platform. With the theme of “Sustainable Civil Engineering Technology Towards a New Revolution”, the ICoSC & MUTRFC conference has successfully attracted 33 participants to present their research works and another 60 as conference participants.

All papers submitted for presentation at ICoSC & MUTRFC and for publication in the journals were subjected to a double-blind, peer review process by competent reviewers. Submissions for this conference are accepted in both English and Malay languages. The selected papers will be published either in Jurnal Kejuruteraan (ISSN: 0128 0198) and Journal of Civil Engineering Technology (PUO) (eISSN 2735 1262).

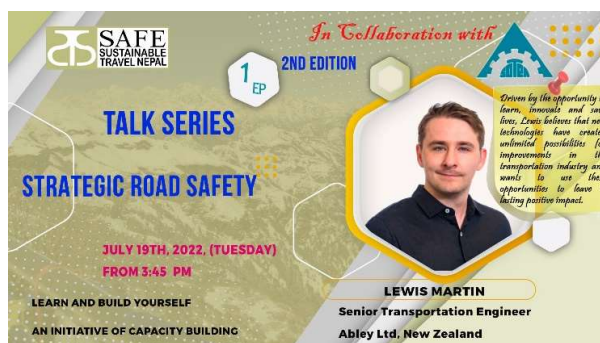


Image 9: Guest Speaker in Tak Program, Mr. Lewis Martin

6. Research Support

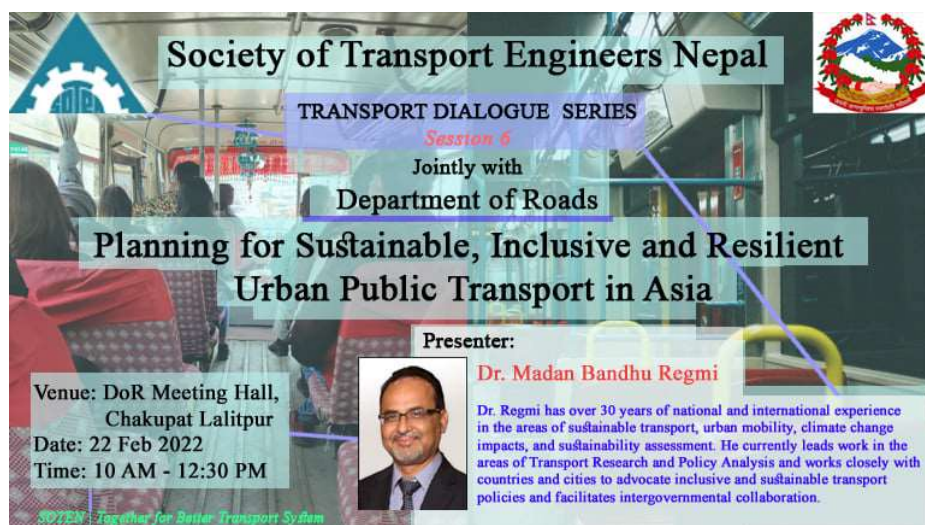

🔍 EASTS NZ activities since October 2021

2020-22

- You may remember that EASTS NZ approached International Transport Forum (ITF) in late 2019 with a very positive response. As a consequence, I made a formal proposal to ITF through EASTS President Dr Oh who had a meeting with ITF secretary general in Paris in February 2020. The aim was for EASTS to join ITF (International Transport Forum) to get increased international exposure with a focus on Transport, Urban Planning and Logistics in association with Natural Disaster Management with EASTS YP – Young Power of EASTS to represent young professionals at ITF/OECD. **Unfortunately, this never became part of the discussion and there has been a lack of communication about the topic since February 2020 with Dr Oh and I was not able to raise this at the last board meeting, that moved to a zoom version and kept to a minimum in terms of discussions. I was hoping to pick it up in Hiroshima next month, but Covid is turning the Hiroshima conference to a virtual one.**
- Constant reshuffling of membership to only keep active and interested parties as members, coming to a point to start recruiting new members from universities. Since travel to/from New Zealand is at stand-still for 2 years, the interest regarding international connections has been quiet.
- Liaising with industry and tertiary education to identify how EASTS could add value for them. On a local level, there has been interaction with industry and tertiary education and government as there is a great opportunity to enhance positive effects of cultural diversity. This step can only though be taken when there is a picture of Covid-19 being under some level of control and foreign students able to return to New Zealand.
Update: very slow
- Preparation of 2021-22 EASTS NZ report
- Attraction of 3 sponsors: ContainerCo (Auckland), DSL Logistics (Auckland), Port of Napier (Napier)
- Retirement of Daniel Silva (managing director of DSL Logistics) after many years from being Vice-president of EASTS NZ. Dt Lincoln Wood accepted to be VP for EASTS NZ.
- Preparation and submission of an International Research Group (IRG) project in conjunction with EASTS Australia, EASTS Indonesia and EASTS Japan. Topic: ***Investigating Accessibility of Indigenous Heritage and Historic Places***. A number of online zoom meetings have happened but progress is slow.

What next for the next 12-24 months?

Outcome of achievements and non-achievements 2022-2023

The objectives and targets set in September 2019 for the next 2 years were set at a high level, without the knowledge of Covid-19. Progress over the last 12 months was limited as a result of Covid-19 and general lack of communication with stakeholders.

The main bullet points outline the intentions in 2019 and indented bullet points the outcome.

- Initiate EASTS NZ seminars with the support of academics and industry to outline tangible value of networking between EASTS NZ members and industry sponsors
 - Effort was put towards industry sponsorship
 - Current status is uncertainty of sponsorship of past sponsors!
 - EASTS NZ bank account negative since Colombo conference
- Encourage more industry leaders to partner with EASTS NZ
 - While EASTS is of relevance to Japan or Korea, it is less to New Zealand, as not bringing any direct advantages, unless a company is looking for specialised staff or tertiary educators looking for students.
 - Make NZ industries understand how isolated NZ is and how much they rely on international business. EASTS is a good vehicle for networking.
- Leading to set-up the EASTS YP Young Professional platform for information exchange
 - In *s/low* progress, this has been on hold, since Cambodia meeting was cancelled.
- Exposing EASTS more to the NZ government, ASEAN et al. to outline the benefits of EASTS as a good example for multi-cultural diversity and co-operation at academic level.
 - I expect the IRG project to help becoming a catalyst for attention as it involves transport – tourism and multi-cultural aspects.
- Encouraging EASTS to send an EASTS team to give presentations at the 2022 Leipzig ITF and be recognised as the organisation best experienced at advising on disaster management relating to transport, urban planning, logistics. This will need strong support from my Japanese colleagues.
 - Supporting material prepared for EASTS President to take to his February ITF meeting in Paris but the item was never discussed.
 - Covid-19 did not allow joining ITF conference, but hopes for EASTS to join ITF 2022 with EASTS Funding
- Start-ups of new IRG for 2021-2024
 - Progress has been made
- EASTS NZ will continue knocking on industry doors for sponsorship, looking for a patron but times are tough and investment into international affairs is difficult >> **EASTS NZ though urgently needs more partners to survive!!**

Basically, the situation has not changed much since last year, as NZ has only slowly opened up its borders and everyone is slowly starting to adjust. Immigration policy is not straight forward, a reason NZ industry or academia has no strong international focus right now. I am confident this will improve come spring/summer.

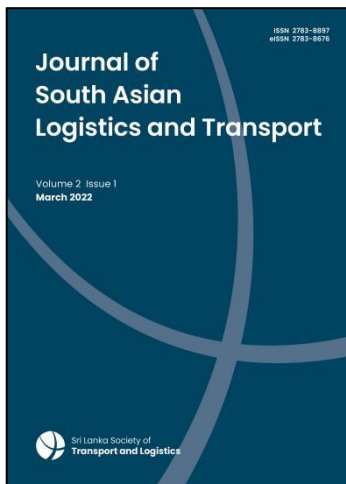
