






mentees' nationalities









day one workshop evaluation


The workshop has helped me realise how diverse the pedestrian experiences are.



The workshop has helped me see how a person's intersecting identities can affect their walking experience and their transport experience in general.




I now have a better idea of how considering **intersectionality** in planning/designing/improving our transport systems can promote **equity**.




Day 2 evaluation of event objectives


Objective 1: Encourage **discussion on career opportunities and challenges** among the mentees and mentors coming from various career stages and various career pathways.



Strengths

- ECR Network. Network initiated before the EASTS Conference. Hence, attending ECRs are able to reconnect during the conference activities.
- **Mentors**. Diverse and come from various transport fields. Really networked with the mentees.
- Funding and other support. Especially from EASTS and local organising committee (TSSM).

Opportunities

- Continuous support from EASTS. Especially on disseminating the invitation beyond the organisers' networks.
- Maintaining the ECR networks formed.

Weaknesses

- **Need more diversity**. About one-third of mentees and mentors come from one nationality.
- Schedule improvements. e.g., consideration of religious practices, more discussion time, etc.
- Language barrier

Threats

- Organisers for future iterations
- Uncertainty on funding source

What is good about it?

- ENGAGEMENT Bringing people of different background to share their thoughts and experiences, providing avenue for researchers to interact
- MENTORING mentors are very friendly and approachable; Almost oneon-one talk with the mentors, also the forum where mentors can be asked about their experiences
- **DIFFERENT CAREER PATHS** academe, advocacy, government & industry; Workshop on future career paths as a researcher; Diverse experiences and engagement
- NETWORKING Good opportunity for networking, networking with transport people
- **BELONGING, R&R** Give opportunity to know other ECRs before Conference; I am very happy to participate in this, besides I can use my vacation after last week's proposal defence.
- WALKING TOUR Health walk, Outdoor activity
- TOPICAL Topics and talks were relevant and informative; Lecture about how to write the paper; Provide abstract teaching; Persona group activities; Very insightful, Amazing program
- **BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF INTERSECTIONAL EQUITY**, chance to mingle with the same path in research as yours.

What can be improved?

TIME MANAGEMENT - increase the time for abstract review, time schedule, time felt a bit tight during discussion portions, More time during writeshop; Maybe you can have alot time for write; Providing more time; Maybe the workshop where we used the pedestrian experience tool. I feel like it took so much time.

MORE TIME FOR CONVERSATIONS - Provide enough time for conversation with mentors and mentees and other mentees.

DURATION - Extending to at least 3 days; Extend another 1 day :)

MAINTAIN THE NETWORK - discuss together what can be done together in future with mentor mentee; Maybe one to one mentoring who required from student side; More opportunities for mentee to mentee networking

COMMUNICATION POST- FORUM - To have one channel of communication to announce on any changes in the program apart from using email.

OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES - Taking outside activities more; More icebreakers especially during afternoons; Mentees would discuss transport their own country
